POSITION: INTRO - Open-facing M fcg wall; DANCE - From BFLY blend to OP fcg LOD

FOOTWORK: Opposite. Directions given for M except as noted

MEASURES INTRODUCTION

1 - 4 WAIT; WAIT; APART, POINT,-; TOGETHER(to Bfly), TOUCH,-;

In Open-facing Pos M fcg wall wait 2 meas;; Step apt from ptr on L, point R twd ptr,-; Step tog on R assuming BFLY POS, tch L to R,-;

DANCE

1 - 4 FWD WALTZ(W ROLL),2,3;STEP,TCH,-; STEP,SWING,-; (Bfly) FACE,-,CLOSE (to Rev. OP);

Blending from Bfly to OP fcg LOD Mwaltzes fwd 1 meas L,R,L as he leads W into a RF roll prog LOD (R,L,R) to end in OP fcg LOD; Step R fwd, tch L to R,-; Step L fwd with a slight dip, swing R fwd,-; Turning to face wall & ptr & assuming BFLY step R swd along RLOD,-, close L to R (canter rhythm) as ptrs turn to face RLOD in L-OP M's L & W's R hands joined;

5 - 8 FWD WALTZ(W Rev ROLL),2,3; STEP,TCH,-; STEP,SWING,-; (CP)FACE,-,CLOSE (CP);

Starting M's R & prog RLOD repeat action of Meas 1-4 with opp ftwk (W making a LF or Rev roll on Meas 5) & assuming CP for the canter step of Meas 8 M fcg wall;;;

9 - 12 DIP BK,-,-; MANUV,2,3; WALTZ TURN(RF); WALTZ IN PLACE(W RF twirl) to FACE; CP M fcg wall dip bk twd COH on L,-,-; Maneuver with 3 steps R,L,R to end CP M fcg RLOD; Starting bwd on M's L do 1 RF turning waltz to end M fcg LOD; While M does 1 waltz R,L,R in place W twirls RF under M's L & W's R hands to end in FACING POS both hands joined M facing LOD;

13 - 16 STEP,SWING,-; STEP,SWING,-; STEP,SWING,-; WALTZ IN PLACE(W Rev Twirl) TO BFLY-BJO;

Starting M's L do 3 step-swings, the swing being made across supporting ft & between ptrs;;; Meas 16 M waltzes in place R,L,R as W does a LF twirl under M's R & W's L hands (L,R,L) to end in BFLY-BJO M fcg diag LOD & COH;

17 - 20 BWD TWINKLE; BWD TWINKLE; BWD TWINKLE; CROSS,TCH,-;

Starting M's L do 3 twinkle steps prog RLOD M XIB (W XIF);;; Meas 20 step R XIB of L (W XIF), tch L to R,-;

21 - 24 FWD TWINKLE; FWD TWINKLE; FWD TWINKLE; FWD (CP),TCH,-;

Starting M's L do 3 fwd twinkle steps prog LOD M XIF (W XIB);;; Meas 24 step R fwd assuming CP, tch L to R to end CP M fcg LOD,-;

25 - 28 DIP BK,-,-; FWD,STEP,STEP; DIP BK, , , FWD,STEP,STEP;

CP dip bwd twd RLOD on L,-,-; Step R fwd, step L,R in place; Repeat action of Meas 25 & 26;;

29 - 32 WALTZ (LF); WALTZ (LF); (OP)FWD,TCH,-; BK,TCn(to Bfly),-;

Starting M's L do 2 LF turning waltzes prog LOD ending in OP fcg LOD;; Step L fwd, tch R to L,-; Step R bwd, tch L to R blending to BFLY to start dance from the beginning,-;

COMPLETE DANCE IS DONE THREE TIMES IN ALL

ENDING: Twirl & Ack on Meas 31-32 last time through.

This month I am saluting (1) the dancers I Least Like to Dance With - the Scowlers. And I make particular reference to the ones who scowl and mutter 'I can't hear!'

Of course, there are other Scowlers, too. There are the ones who think one couple in the square should not have come to the dance at all, because they are not up to 'our standards', and consider that they - the Scowlers - are stuck. They lose no opportunity of exchanging sour glances and shrugs, often making the poor 'outsiders' goof even worse. I honestly don't think there is a square dancer anywhere who is incompetent enough to spoil a square for me - but a Scowler in the same square succeeds in doing it easily.

Then there is the Scowler who does not think the Caller is good enough to call for him. Maybe the regular Caller has given a newcomer a guest spot, and our friend never heard of him. Maybe the poor guest, nervous already, flubs a line or delays too long. Out come the scowls, and all the efforts of the rest of us to enjoy ourselves in spite of the calling are wet-blanketed.

One particularly annoying Scowler is the guy who comes to the Round-Up, but comes only on Saturday night. All day Saturday and all day Sunday, there has been plenty of room, and plenty to learn and enjoy. But the Big Name Callers are on Saturday night, so our friend comes then, and the place is too crowded! So he scowls as he is battered around the floor, and complains bitterly about the sound and the mob and the level, and swears never to come back. He always does, but still at peak time. He never learns.

I suppose one reason why I am especially annoyed by the Scowler who 'can't hear', is that I see so much of the work and effort that goes into licking the sound problem at most of the big dances. The way most of our larger halls are designed, it is simply unrealistic to expect the same clear sound we are used to having at our Club dances. In spite of really heroic efforts on the part of Callers and Dance Committees, some of our halls continue to whip everyone. But from the way the Scowlers look, and the way they talk, you would think that anything less than perfect sound was something the Caller had deliberately inflicted on them, just to annoy.

And how about the ones who say they 'can't hear' when no one else in the square has any trouble? Do they mean that they really do have poor hearing, and should get special consideration? Or don't they actually know how they sound? Don't they know that a good square dancer has to hear only about a quarter as much as a poor dancer? Do they realize that what they are really saying is 'I can't think as fast as that'? I'll admit that it is probably true, and if they actually put it that way, I'd sympathize. But going around the square with a frown on your face, muttering to everyone 'The sound is terrible - I can't hear', is simply trying to shift the blame for mistakes onto someone else. The same mistakes, done with spirit and recognized with a wide grin that says "I goofed again!", can raise the spirits of everyone in the square. A whole floor goofing with enthusiasm and howls of laughter is one of the happiest sights in square dancing. But please - no scowls!
