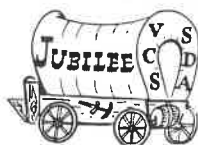

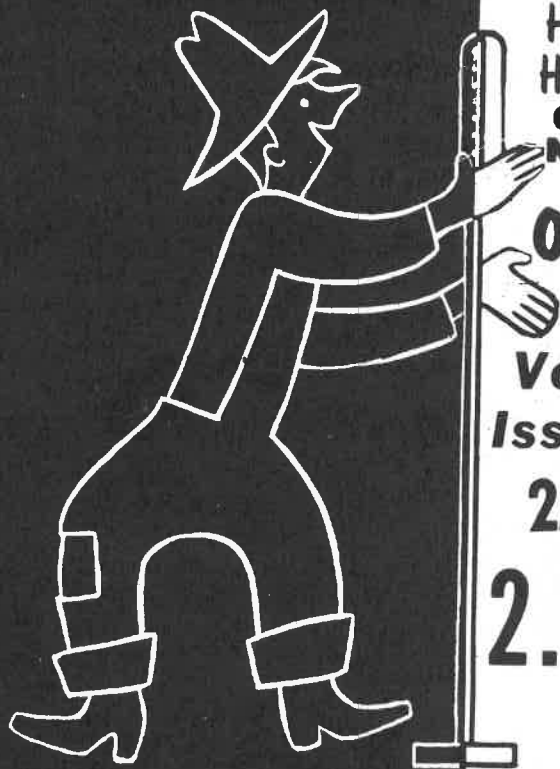

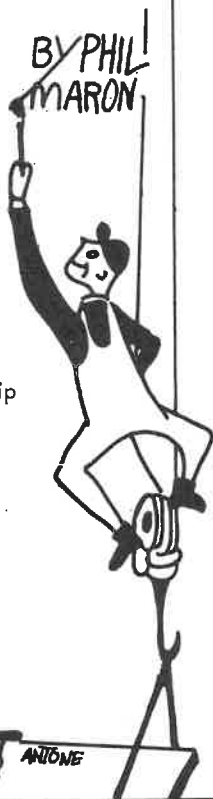

The Round Dance Dilemma!

I was asked by the executive board of the Square Dance Callers' Association of Northern California to air a problem which is besetting most of our member callers. This is the problem of our Round of the Month. As many of you know, the Round is selected by popular vote of the members present of the Round Dance Teachers' Association of Northern California at their Sunday meeting.

To qualify as the choice of the month, the Round must neither be too easy, or too difficult. The choice for the past several years has been excellent for the most part and this is not our prime problem. The big fly in the ointment is that the record is not available upon presentation of the Round.

Several weeks elapse before the caller gets his record. He has forgotten the Round and must re-learn it. In the meantime, he is getting pressure from dancers most anxious to learn the new Round. Scuttle-butt has it that some round dance teachers are buying and cleaning the shelves of the record dealers of the new Round before it is even presented at Callers' Association, and members of round dance classes are thus getting the jump on the callers, by receiving the record before they do! There is nothing unethical about teaching the chosen round before being adopted as Round of the Month. The harm occurs if round dance teachers announce it as the "New Round of the Month" thereby creating the demand by dancers for the record. I'm sure that our representatives Ray & Jean Hanna, check the record companies to be assured the record is in stock. Perhaps our local record people are holding back on ordering, when their orders should

exceed twice what they now are. My understanding is that what they don't sell may be exchanged for more popular releases, so they're really not getting stuck on excessive orders.

If the situation does not ease up, we'll go back to the old method which none of us liked. This is the leaning of two rounds, and hand-voting for the best-liked one. It makes for a long afternoon, and our choice is not always the best one. Top that with the fact we still have to wait for the record to be ordered by our local record shops, and we are no better, even worse off than before!

Our fervent plea is in essence directed to the Round Dance Teachers and the record shops. Won't you please make sure that an adequate number of records are on hand the 4th Sunday of the Round month. That's all we ask.

Incidentally some clarification on when the Round of the Month becomes Round of the Month may be in order. It officially becomes 'Round of the Month' when it appears in Square Dance-Where? This allows at least a month for the dancers to really learn the dance well, and look their best on the floor. I know that many dancers pressure the callers to use the dance at Hoedowns before that time, and understandably so. When a fine, popular Round Dance is made Round of the Month, it's difficult to hold back. At an open hoedown though, it may become a selfish motive, because dancers who did not learn the dance soon enough must stand in envy and watch other dancers enjoy it. Dancers, whose caller was lucky enough to get the record immediately.

Dance Badge in white with red lettering which says support the American Square Dance.

The Santa Clara Valley Square Dance Association and the American Legion with the support of the State Council are working towards putting through Congress a bill to declare Square Dancing the National Dance. These Badges are being sold at one dollar each to pay for lobbying and cost of advertising. Also, to send Square Dancers to Washington if it becomes necessary. The proceeds from the sale of badges will be put in a National Square Dance Fund, a non-profit organization composed of Square Dancers and American Legionairs. Any money left over after obtaining our objectives will be donated to charity. (Let every Square do its share) and more. Anyone wishing to obtain these badges may get them from their Club Delegate or District Director.

Our first Round-Up meeting has been held and the full committees are starting to get down to the business of planning our next Round-Up. We hope it will be bigger and better than ever. This year we will have a souvenir program and we would like the support of all the clubs in sending in ads to help defray the expenses. These ads will be the same price as ads in Square Dance Where? I am sure that everyone will want one. It will have the history of your Association from its beginning up to the present time. Also, a biography of our Round-Up callers and many more things. All of our District Directors will be soliciting ads for this program. Space will be limited, so don't miss out, start planning now.
