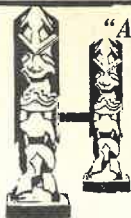

Footwork: Opposite, Directions for M except as noted.

INTRO: WAIT; WAIT; APART, -, POINT, -; TOGETHER (to SCP), -, TOUCH, -;

- 1-2 In Open-Facing pos M's back to COH & M's R hand & W's L hand joined wait 2 measures.
- 3 Step apart on L, -, point R twd partner, -;
- 4 Step together on R blending to Semi-Closed pos facing LOD, -, touch L to R, -;

PART A

(1)(SCP) FWD TWO-STEP; (2) FWD TWO-STEP; (3)(Open Vine) SIDE, -, BEHIND, -;
(4) SIDE, -, CROSS THRU, -;

- 1-2 In Semi-Closed pos start on M's L and do 2 fwd two-steps LOD;
- 3-4 Face partner and do a slow Open-Vine stepping swd LOD on L, -, cross R behind L (both XIB) and open out to momentary Left-Open pos facing RLOD, -; again face partner and step swd LOD on L, -, cross thru twd LOD on R (both XIF) and start blend to Closed pos, -;

(5)(1/2 box) SIDE, CLOSE, FWD, -; (6)(scis thru) SIDE, CLOSE, THRU, -; (7) TURN TWO-STEP; (8) TURN TWO-STEP;

- 5 Blend to Closed pos and step swd LOD on L, close R, fwd twd wall on L, hold 1 ct;
- 6 Swd RLOD on R, close L, cross thru twd LOD on R (both XIF), hold 1 ct;
- 7-8 Blend to Closed pos and starting on M's L do 2 R-face turning two-steps LOD and end in Semi-Closed pos facing LOD;

(9)(SCP) FWD TWO-STEP; (10) FWD TWO-STEP; (11)(Open Vine) SIDE, -, BEHIND, -;
(12) SIDE, -, CROSS THRU, -;

- 9-12 Repeat the action of Meas 1 thru 4;

(13)(1/2 box) SIDE, CLOSE, FWD, -; (14)(scis thru) SIDE, CLOSE, THRU, -; (15) TURN TWO-STEP; (16) TURN TWO-STEP (to Bfly);

- 13-16 Repeat the action of Meas 5 thru 8 except in Butterfly pos M facing wall;

PART B

(17)(Two-Step) FACE-TO-FACE; (18)(Two-Step) BACK-TO-BACK; (19) TURN IN (to Left-Open), -, BACK, -; (20)(Hitch) BACK, CLOSE, FWD (to check), -;

- 17 In Butterfly pos do a swd two-step LOD turning to Open pos on last step;
- 18 Turn to back-to-back pos (lead hands joined) and do a swd two-step LOD by starting on M's R and turning to Open pos facing LOD on last step;
- 19 Roll LOD turning 1/2 R-face on L (W L-fc on R) one slow step ending in Left-Open pos facing RLOD, -, step bwd LOD on R, -;
- 20 Step bwd LOD on L, quickly close R to L, fwd RLOD on L to check fwd motion, hold 1 ct;

(21)(Recov) TURN IN (to SCP), -, FWD, -; (22) FWD TWO-STEP; (23)(CP) PIVOT, -, 2, -;
(24) TWIRL, -, 2, -;

- 21 Recovering bwd LOD on R turn in twd partner (M L-fc, W R-fc) (1 slow step), -; blending to Semi-Closed pos step fwd LOD on L, -;
- 22 Starting on M's R do 1 fwd two-step LOD;
- 23 Blend quickly to Closed pos and do a full turn R-face couple pivot in 2 slow steps L, -, R, -;
- 24 M walks fwd LOD 2 slow steps L, -, R, - as W twirls R face ending in Butterfly pos ready to repeat from meas 17;

(25)(Two-Step) FACE-TO-FACE; (26)(Two-Step) BACK-TO-BACK; (27) ROLL IN (to Left-Open), -, BACK, -; (28)(Hitch) BACK, CLOSE, FWD (to check), -;

- 25-28 Repeat the action of Meas 17 thru 20;

(29)(Recov) TURN IN (to SCP), -, FWD, -; (30) FWD TWO-STEP; (31)(CP) PIVOT, -, 2, -;
(32) TWIRL, -, 2, - (to SCP);

- 29-32 Repeat the action of Meas 21 thru 24 except end in Semi-Closed pos fc LOD;

DANCE GOES THRU TWICE

END: (SCP) FWD TWO-STEP; FWD TWO-STEP; TWIRL-VINE, -, 2, -; AP T, -, PT, -;

- 1-2 In Semi-Closed pos start on M's L and do 2 fwd two-steps LOD;
- 3 W does a slow R-face twirl LOD as M steps swd on L, -, cross R in back, -;
- 4 Step swd LOD and away from partner on L, -, point R twd partner (change hands) and acknowledge as music ends, -;

LEADERSHIP

by Ed Berryman

The First of a Three part Series

This is the first in a three part series on "Leadership" written by Caller Ed Berryman of San Diego. Ed was a well-known and highly respected caller of many years who passed away just before the presentation of this article to the State Council of Square Dance Callers' Associations. Ed is sorely missed as a leader in his area.

We wish to thank the State Council of Square Dance Associations in allowing us to print this fine article. First time appearing in print!

You know there is another word for Leadership, "Hard Work."

Our democratic system of government offers you, as an individual, more advantages and opportunities than any other system devised. Remember that drones, defeatists and frustration did not build the things you inherited and enjoy daily. But hard work did. Don't conserve your effort and energy and ability to work. It is not actual work that people in our country perform which takes the toll of life, but the real killer agents are worry, insecurity, fear and the desire to escape from work. So don't be afraid to put forth plenty of hard, intelligent work in your drive towards your goals in being a leader.

Perhaps you are wondering why we do not lay down some rules for leadership. Well, we just can't say in three easy lessons what leadership is all about. This is one thing that can not come the easy way.

My conception of leadership is built on that fundamental thing called work, and that leadership is built from within the individual. The individual must put his own house in order before he can be expected to make any worthwhile contributions to others. To qualify for any job, including caller, teacher, or leader, he must have knowledge and experience of the things which he is expected to perform and administer. His thinking, attitudes and philosophy towards his superiors, associates, and subordinates must be human, understanding and objective. He must overcome his own weaknesses before he can reasonably expect others to overcome their weaknesses. He must demonstrate good "follower" ability with his superiors before he can expect to have his subordinates follow his leadership. People are not born with leadership ability, but acquire this valuable asset as they progress through life. Until you reduce the negative qualities in your make-up, you cannot

supply any other type of leadership ability but the negative type.

Don't always look to the other fellow to do the job of making life easier for you. He probably is also waiting for you to lead the way. Someone must start the ball rolling. So why don't you, THE CALLER? This is an excellent way to overcome "feelings of frustration" and at the same time put into practice GOOD LEADERSHIP.

We can meet the problems, whether they be mechanical or human, in two ways. First, by the use of intelligent, logical and concise reasoning. Second, by giving play to our feelings and emotions; giving vent to our likes and dislikes; flying into a rage or temper tantrum; being explosive, stormy, roaring, sarcastic, or vicious in an attempt to dominate and control some situation or person.

Emotional thinking is the cause of most of the problems experienced in humans and the square dance world. How do we respond when someone "flies up in our face?" Naturally, we find it rather difficult to remain calm, cool, collected and emotionally detached. However, it is the only way to control intelligently situations and issues of this kind.

If you resent this kind of treatment (and I don't know of anyone who likes it) and display of emotionalism, remember NEVER to indulge in the practice regardless of the provocation or how trying the situation may be. (Remember you can't win by being emotional.) Nor can you become or remain an intelligent leader in square dancing if you try to direct or dominate people by your emotions. Callers, teachers and leaders who are emotional, "blow hot and cold" on dancers. A caller or teacher may be a fairhaired boy one day and not "worth his salt" a month later. If this should be your technique in dealing with dancers, the obvious results are clear.

The emotional technique will not work with square dancers. Maybe you have already tried it and found it reacts against you. If you haven't learned, you know now why you have trouble and difficulty with people; why it is so hard to get things done. Stop injecting emotional thinking in your plans. Try using a sane, analytical, intelligent approach—IT REALLY WORKS.

Experiences in square dancing and all kinds of leadership, process real value to us if we have enough sense to use it in a constructive way. Whether we classify experiences as good or bad is purely a personal evaluation—for it is largely in this manner that we learn and develop judgment.

Defeatism is another of the highly defense mechanisms used by the individual to express dissatisfaction and discouragement. Largely the result of feelings of frustration.

The attitude "it can't be done" is one of the most irritating responses one can receive from a leader or teacher. Although we frequently find this attitude in square dancers, leaders and teachers. Very often people take this attitude because they are bored or "fed up" with the job they have, or it comes because of pure physical laziness on the part of the individual who merely wishes to hold on to his job and who does not think it worth-while to make any additional, extended effort. He cannot see any real personal return if he does arouse himself and make an effort to comply with the suggestions or the requirements of his job.

The literal truth is not that "it can't be done" but that "we do not wish to do it." This is not a leader. A good leader will always say, "What can't be done?" Nothing is impossible—it may only take a little longer." The fact still remains that nothing is impossible. Knowledge is always present—it is only our limitations which govern our progress and advancement. If a person says "it can't be done," just say move over, brother, some one can do it if you can't or won't.

The capable leader or teacher in square dancing is not concerned over authority, prestige or disciplinary powers; he or she has the ability to lead dancers only. The fact of the matter is, the average square dancer is looking for "leadership" he only thinks of being treated as a human being. If we are violating the principles of good human relations, we should have sufficient

intelligence to make necessary changes in our technique of leadership. As a caller or teacher we apparently impressed someone with our intelligence, otherwise we would not have been selected to occupy a superior position and been given an opportunity to demonstrate leadership ability.

We can begin to visualize how much influence the composite personality pattern of square dance callers and presidents of clubs who are leaders will have on the square dance picture. How the type and calibre of leadership in a club will establish its philosophy of operation and the degree of success of the square dance picture. How we must continue to expand, not only our knowledge of the job, but also our own technique as caller and leader, if we wish to grow in ability to handle people more effectively.

Friendliness is the keystone in all human relations. Tact, courtesy, patience, understanding and tolerance are words we hear constantly. We can probably define these words in an abstract way, but when it comes to practice and living these traits, few people recognize the value of these qualities when applied to their jobs. However, most people try to practice these traits in their social activities so that they will be accepted by others. (Why don't you!)

You no doubt have, or will at some time, meet people who are uncooperative, self-centered, loud-mouthed, cocky, hard to approach and work with, this is particularly annoying and frustrating if you happen to be, by nature, a courteous, tactful, considerate, self-effacing person who is sincere and anxious to do a job and work with everyone about you. In fact, this situation can become a major problem in your square dance environment and cause you considerable difficulty in doing your job.

What can you do in this kind of a situation? Shall you constantly turn the other cheek, or start open warfare and bring yourself down to their level? Or shall you complain to the higher ups and tell them of your difficulties? None of these methods are effective for obvious reasons, in the first place, no one likes a cry-baby or a stooge. Second, we doubt of you can, or wish to deteriorate to the brawling level of open warfare and clash.

We suggest that you become less sensitive in your relationship with people. When you require more knowledge of human nature,

you will recognize that certain behavior is a compensation for certain weaknesses in people. Actually, the obnoxious, cocky, loud-mouthed braggart, the domineering, overbearing individual is unsure of himself, lacks self-confidence in his relationship with people and uses these negative traits to bolster his ego and cover up his weaknesses. So you see the traits and behavior which so excessively annoy you are merely a veneer or surface hardness to hide feelings of inadequacy in the job and inability to work with people.

When you know why people act as they do, you will not be nearly so much disturbed over their shortcomings and apparent uncooperativeness. Furthermore, you will become more skilled in handling your relationships. You know knowledge is power. Keep observing your associates, their strong and weak points. Substituting understanding for your concern over the way you are being treated.

The basic requirement of leadership is a man's ability to cooperate with the people with whom he works. He must think in terms of the organization and its welfare. If he merely thinks of his position as a stepping stone for his own personal advancement, he is not inclined to extend cooperation, but prefers to play a lone hand. We soon recognize the man who cooperates only when he feels there is something to be gained from us, or because he can put himself in a position to capitalize on our help at some latter date.

To those who are really interested in strengthening their leadership, we suggest constant practice in the following ten procedures:

- 1) be friendly, pleasant and cooperative,
- 2) keep improving your relationships with all associates and subordinates.
- 3) expand your knowledge of people by observing the signs outlined in this article.
- 4) cultivate a favorable reputation. Get people to like you as a person.
- 5) respect the other person.
- 6) treat him as you wish to be treated. Help him to gain the things he wants and needs.
- 7) be courteous at all times. Use the request technique. Never be dictatorial when you issue orders or instructions.
- 8) avoid conflicts and politics. Do your

part to keep friction out of your organization.

9) Be interested in the plans and ideas of others.

10) Actively support the square dance picture. Be sold on your club or organization.
