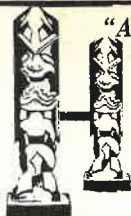

LEADERSHIP

The Second of a Three part Series

People will always make tests to find a good caller. They examine his thinking habits and whether or not he can handle people; and more important, how people respond towards his personality. They test his degree of cooperativeness; qualifications and intelligence versus the demands of the job. Or, whether he/she has been over-rated and is not sufficiently capable of executing properly his present duties and functions.

There are a lot more things a caller must do, than just get up and call a dance. If the square dancers are sold on you and the future of their club, then and then only, will you escape the numerous headaches found in all clubs and dancers. This is exactly what you are looking for. And "there is where the fun is."

Say you find a factional person in a club you call for. Well, don't moralize or preach to the individual; it will not work. After listening to his gripes and complaints for a sufficient length of time, announce in no uncertain terms the fact that you find your job, associates and club entirely enjoyable. In other words, put on a selling campaign. You may be able to sell him if not, you have at least let him know how you feel and where you stand, so he is not likely to bother you again. He is seeking sympathy and encouragement in his attitude, plus a desire "to pull everyone down to his level of thinking." When an individual refuses to think straight, there is very little any of us can do to help him. We cannot live the other fellow's life for him. He is merely the result of his thinking, so are you. You are the only one who can make a charge or an improvement in your personality. This is your problem.

Remember when you help others, you help yourself in more ways than one. It makes you feel good all over. People will want you to succeed, and they will help you reach the top. But why go on listing all the advantages, when they are so obvious to the intelligent man or woman who wishes to acquire leadership ability? If this is "the bunk" in your opinion, it still pays off to those who are willing to learn and who haven't reached the "know it all" stage with a "big shot complex."

Perhaps the only lesson you need to learn can be found in the following observation—you were given two ears to listen with and only one mouth to talk with—learn to keep these two vital organs in direct proportion. Another way to express this very important lesson in life and work can be put in the form of daily prayer:

"Please teach me to keep my big mouth shut until I know what I am talking about."

Let us go on a selling spree, sell square dancing to everyone you come in contact with, inside and outside your clubs. A caller that can't sell his members on each other is in poor shape as far as leadership is concerned. But before you protect or sell, look at yourself in the mirror and see if the reflected image is perfect, or whether you could make some improvements in your relationship with the other members of your organization.

May we remind you that your associates (callers, teachers and leaders) are also reading this article and some are applying the contents to themselves just as you should be doing at this moment. If you are a leader of dancers, or want to be a leader, do not wait for the other man to supply your leadership, but always anticipate and be a jump ahead of the gun. The man who waits for someone else to supply the leadership and stimulate into action is not a leader, but simply a follower at heart.

How many times have we seen "club meetings" held on subjects, such as "what are we going to eat" at the next party night, in hopes that the club "will hit the sawdust trail," and very often these meetings, or "conferences" (if you prefer,) deteriorate into super-charged, emotional discussion, especially with bitter and abusive harangue at its core; the very opposite of the application we want. So we all know we must have meetings to get things done. But meetings can be held very well if you are the proper leader and not let things get out of hand. Crimp the bad things in the bud, before they get started, and above all do not add "fuel to the fire."

Believe in the value of ideas, not only yours, but also in the ideas of others. You know the square dance movement is looking

for men and women with ideas, who can supply creative imagination. It takes applied imagination to meet competition and grow in size. We need to apply creative imagination not only to our square dance problems, but also to our human problems. It takes creative imagination to sell square dancing and to make improvements in the way that they like to work, to arouse creative imagination in square dancers, we must use real imagination in the way we stimulate and encourage people to give their best contribution. We must study the best way to give recognition, rewards and incentives. Don't tell us you haven't had opportunity for exercising creative imagination in your job of leadership, your trouble is not lack of opportunity or a personal lack of creative talent, but failure to exercise your ability, like all other human traits and characteristics, you possess creativeness to some degree; the degree of development depends entirely on the amount of effort you put forth.

Don't ridicule or try to show superior knowledge when someone has an idea. At least he is thinking along creative lines, which is more than you can claim when you are applying critical judgment to his ideas. Sure, at first glance, many ideas seem "nutty," but just because you have never seen them tried doesn't mean the ideas are useless, or that, with a little creative imagination on your part, you cannot help to make new ideas work.

Only stupid people are contemptuous of ideas. Look about you, at the almost human, automatic machinery which has been developed and "wise up." You haven't any corner on ideas, in fact, no one person has all the knowledge. All the more reason for you to be receptive and take advantage of the help of others. In the final analysis, all any organization has is the pooled knowledge and effort of its members, from the president to the sweeper, and even the sweeper can come up with good ideas.

When you are sitting in a group discussion, listen to ideas being kicked around. Don't be afraid to throw your ideas out for discussion, you might come up with the one that helps find the answer. Reserve your critical judgment until the time arrives to make a choice of the best idea whether it be yours or some other persons. Certainly you should know enough to be tactful in passing opinion on the ideas of others, with-

out having your attention called to the need for consideration of their feelings. People attach the same importance to self as you do. And after a meeting is over, don't go around confiding in people about how absurd and dopey this guy is, or what a slap-happy silly ass some other man made of himself with his ideas. If you do, we will mentally refer your remarks to yourself and see how well you have applied your jealous and envious remarks to yourself (only a "silly ass" goes around criticizing the ideas and constructive efforts of others.)

Ideas are diamonds in the rough and must be polished and worked to have value.

Keep looking at your job as a leader, and try to find out how you can improve the value of you, the diamond.
