LAZY POLKA

RECORD: "Lazy Polka" - Belco B-241-A

POSITION: Ptrs facing, M fcg wall, no hands joined for Intro; Bfly M fcg wall for Dance

FOOTWORK: Opposite; directions for M except as noted

MEASURES

INTRODUCTION

1 - 2 WAIT; UP (on toes), DOWN (in place), STAMP/STAMP,STAMP;

1...Fcg ptr & wall hands free wait 1 meas;

2...With feet tog lift upon toes, down in place (weight on both feet), step in place R/L, R accenting these 3 steps with stamp;

PART A

1 - 4 (Bfly)VINE,2,STEP/STEP,STEP(Bk-to-Bk); VINE,2,STEP/STEP,STEP;

AWAY,2,STEP/CLOSE,STEP; TOGETHER,2,STEP/CLOSE,STEP(Bfly);

1...In Bfly M fcg wall step swd LOD L, XRIB of L, do 3 quick steps L/R,L in place (turning to BK-TO-BK POS retaining joined trailing hands);

2...In Bk-to-Bk Pos step swd LOD R, XLIB of R, then 3 quick steps in place R/L,R ending M fcg COH (W fcg wall);

3...Turning away from ptr M LF (W RF) walk 2 steps L,R, then do one two-step L/R,L turning to face ptr;

4...Walk twd ptr in 2 steps R,L, then do one two-step R/L,R to end in momentary BFLY POS M fcg wall;

5 - 8 (Bfly)ROLL,2(face),STEP/STEP,STEP; (RLOD)ROLL,2(face),STEP/STEP,STEP;

BACK AWAY,2,STEP/STEP,STEP; TOGETHER,2,STEP/STEP,STEP (CP);

5...M rolls LF (W RF) down LOD L,R to face ptr, then step in place L/R,L;

6...Repeat action of Meas 5 in RLOD R,L,R/L,R to end M fcg ptr & wall;

7...Back away from ptr L,R, then step in place L/R,L;

8...Walk twd ptr R,L, then step in place R/L,R to end CP M fcg wall;

9 - 10 (CP)TURN TWO-STEP,TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP,TURN TWO-STEP (Bfly M fcg LOD);

9-10...Starting M's L (W's R) do 4 FAST turning two-steps prog LOD to end in BFLY POS M fcg LOD;;

PART B

11-14 (Bfly)HEEL,TOE,SLIDE/CLOSE,STAMP; HEEL,TOE,SLIDE/CLOSE,STAMP;

HEEL,TOE,SLIDE/CLOSE,STAMP; HEEL,TOE,SLIDE/CLOSE,STAMP;

11...Bfly M fcg LOD starting M's L (W's R) bending knees slightly tch L heel to floor diag fwd & to the L side, bring L ft bk & tch L toe to floor beside R toe, step swd L / twd COH close R to L, stamp L;

12...Starting M's R (W's L) moving twd wall R heel diag fwd & to R side, bring R bk & tch R toe to floor beside L toe, step swd R / twd wall close L to R, stamp R;

13...Repeat action of Meas 11 twd COH;

14...Repeat action of Meas 12 twd wall;

15-16 (Twd COH)TWIRL VINE,2,STEP/STEP,STAMP; (Twd wall)TWIRL VINE,2,STEP/STEP,STAMP;

15...M fcg LOD step swd twd COH L, cross R behind L (W twirl R,L), then do 3 quick steps in place L/R,L stamping on third step;

16...Starting M's R (W's L) repeat action of Meas 15 twd wall ending in CP M fcg wall;

17-18 (CP)TURN TWO-STEP,TURN TWO-STEP;TURN TWO-STEP,TURN TWO-STEP (Bfly M fcg wall);

17-18...Repeat action of Meas 9-10 Part A to end in BFLY M fcg wall & ptr;;

SEQUENCE: INTRO - A - B - A - B - TAG.

TAG: W TWIRL,2(Half-OP),WALK,2; STEP/STEP,STAMP,-,-;

M walks 4 steps LOD L,R,L,R (as W twirls in 2 steps R,L to end in HALF-OP, & walks R,L); Do quick step/step,stamp fcg LOD,-,-.

LEADERSHIP

The Third and Final part of a three part Series

LIFE IS A LABORATORY

We are all familiar with the term "Research Laboratory" where scientific investigation and development take place in science and in fields of human endeavor, technicians and experts spend their whole lives working out principles and applications for knowledge gained in scientific investigations. Business and industry spend millions for this purpose. But we the square dance caller spends very little for the purpose of dancer relationship.

Unfortunately, nothing is being spent for the morale and the response of the dancer. We frequently lose sight of the fact that the individual is all important. If the caller, leader and dancer are not thoroughly sold on the club or organization as a whole, you cannot expect to have a hard-hitting organization which "gets things done." Look about you and check the unsuccessful clubs you know. They have organizational structure in form, but in reality, chaos, confusion, friction and unrest. When times get tough, what happens? "Reorganization." As you know a chain is as strong as its weakest link.

However, this does not need to stop us or even slow us down. The individual always has freedom of thought, to accept or reject as he pleases. We are living in a huge laboratory where, up to now, we have experimented by the "trial and error method" on the art of living with people.

We have, of necessity, been compelled to be our own teachers in the field of dancer relationship. In many instances our self-teaching methods have been wrong and, by continual practice, we have instilled these errors in our behavior, attitude and response toward others. The whole principle can be best illustrated by comparison to learning to play some musical instrument or call a dance. If we are taught wrong, we not only have to unlearn the bad habits practiced and acquired over a period of time, but we must then learn and cultivate new habits and skills. This is where the old adage, "Practice makes perfect" can

be wrong when applied indiscriminately. Practice makes perfect only when the ideal or principle is right.

The leadership series is written as a supplement to the job caller evaluation procedure which stops at analyzing the functional part of your position. We assume that you know the specific duties and responsibilities of your work and the penalties you pay when an attempt is made to escape any portion of it. Carry this same thinking on into the field of dancer relationship and recognize the penalties you pay in escaping the undefined duties and responsibilities you must also give to the dancer and other callers. One of the human values is commonly called cooperation—hold it! Don't go flying past this word! Back up! Do you know the real meaning of cooperation?

Cooperation is a tremendous word to define, understand and practice. In fact, a large part of escape mechanism is due primarily to the lack of knowledge of the real meaning of the word and the ability to live and practice what it stands for, of course, we hear people mouth the word and profess cooperation until we grow tired of hearing the word. "The man doth protest too much" really applies to the word cooperation. "By their acts, ye shall know them" is much better and more concrete method of judging people and their performance, contribution and worth in a job.

Any individual can escape almost any situation not to his liking by recourse to evasion and by ducking cooperation. Life and work are largely formed by a well-developed sense of personal responsibility. We are not only responsible for ourselves, but also have an obligation to the dancer. This is especially true of those who occupy the positions of caller, teacher and leader. You are the guiding hands of the clubs and organizations. Escape will not build the individual or his job.

This is an excellent spot in the leadership series to explore the value of work as the way to handle escapism. In the past articles, we have made reference to work in

general, but not in sufficient detail to drive home its importance in square dancing. Many people have a distorted view of the meaning of work and feel that it should be avoided whenever possible. In fact, we have seen people "work hard" and spend a considerable amount of mental and nervous energy in their efforts to escape.

Years ago, people had pride in their work and in the fact that they were industrious. The desire to accomplish and make a contribution was one of the basic values of life. Today, in many quarters, the word work is in disrepute and anyone who has a philosophy of "hard work" is at least a reactionary, if not a damn fool. Hard work is not a disgrace. Some people must work harder than others to reach or gain his objectives.

Frankly we are directing this message to you the leader and caller. How often have you heard parents advise their children to "get an education so that you don't have to work as hard as your father does in life?" Education, in the popular sense, should prepare the individual "to live by his wits" and escape that dreadful thing called hard work." Unfortunately, we do not prepare the younger generation for their disillusionment when they start out in the world "to earn their own living" and "stand on their own feet" and find that only hard work really "pays-off" regardless of any concept we may have of the word or previous indoctrination we have received from parents and others professing interest in our welfare.

Actually, it is not our intention to advise younger people against the principle of hard work, but we are simply confused in our association of words. We are trying to save those in whom we are interested from our worries, fears, anxieties, frustrations, and feelings of insecurity. We have these feelings all mixed-up and identified with work so that work now symbolizes all our failures and disappointments. Just an education is not intended to be a substitute for life, or to offer an escape from work.

Work is not negative, but is the foundation on which personal happiness is built. A man must work his way out of his problems. He must work for his happiness. He must work for whatever he wants, needs and desires; otherwise it has little or no value. Pride of accomplishment is only to be gained through work.
