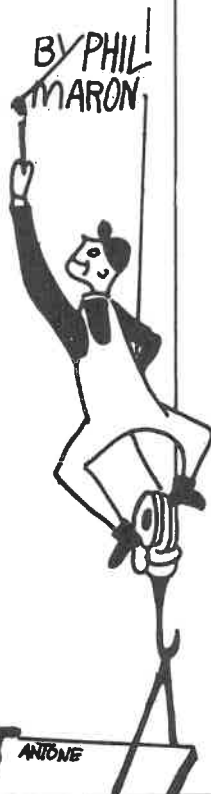

Gentlemen:

Have you ever wondered why we have so many deaf or hard-of-hearing Square Dancers? We are convinced the cause is the forever blairing audio systems.

We have been dancing all our lives and since 1965 been "emphasizing" "high level" square dancing, and have danced all over the country and Canada (some five round trips coast-to-coast at over 8,000 miles each trip), attending conventions, clinics, festivals, jubilees, parties and gatherings of all description suffering the same, crucifying, ear-splitting, shattering noise. We have tried to form our squares in the back of the hall or avoid being in line with the speakers but it is no use. Even ear-plugs, which are very uncomfortable to wear, help very little - but I am forced to wear them to make it at all bearable, and have even considered giving up square dancing and go back to Folk Dancing, rather than have my very keen hearing ruined. Besides the constant noise is very wearing, physically - like being battered around - never tire from dancing even all afternoon and evening.

There have been many scientific studies made on the effect of sound on the human system and hearing and it is quite frightening. Many teen-agers have lost their hearing from their loud music - in fact the scientists predict we might have a whole deaf generation if something isn't done immediately.

Will you not bring this up at your next meeting - advise the hard-of-hearing dancers to turn up their hearing-aids rather than ruin the rest of us. We have heard many complaints such as ours, but no one seems to do anything about it. Sometimes our favorite caller calls real softly to "hear or rather listen to our footsteps" and it is absolute heaven, and yet I have never heard anyone say they could not hear, so why must we go thru all that "torture" so needlessly.

Another bad thing about such excruciating sound is the distortion, actually to the point that you can't hear the call at all when it is so loud!

There is another eventuality that the callers should watch, which is rather difficult for them. The best callers, the ones who really give it all they have, work themselves up to a climatic pitch of sound and rhythm that must make the very speakers strain and vibrate, now, we wouldn't move a finger to stifle this most exciting calling which makes us so exultant, our feet scarcely touch the ground (if our ears survive!). So this is all the more reason that the sound should be tuned low to provide for these wonderful cre-scendos, so that they can be fully enjoyed, rather than endured.

Would appreciate anything that can be done to remedy this situation that prevails everywhere. Please excuse this hastily written letter with the inevitable mistakes, just haven't time to compose one properly.

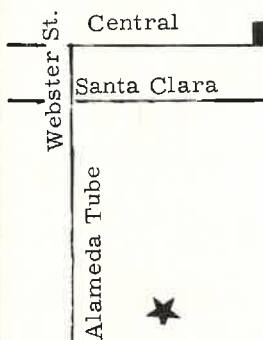

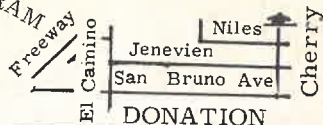

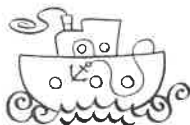
