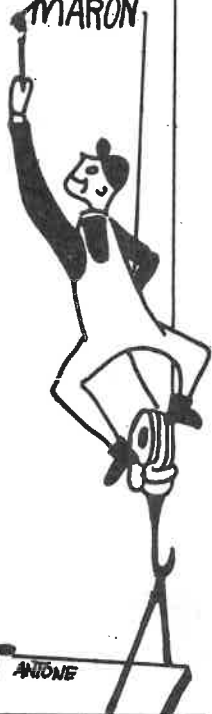

Square Dancers Ass'n No. Calif. 'President's Message' Maynard Bish

This month your Association will become 20 years old. It was just twenty years ago that this Association held its first meeting. As you know, our Board meets on the 3rd Sunday of every month. We are planning on holding this month's meeting in the old Seibecker Hall in San Francisco where the very first meeting was held. We have invited the first President, Walter Wells and his wife to be our guests. Also, the Presidents of the two charter member clubs, the Grasshoppers and the 49'ers. The commemoration of this event complete with publicity and pictures is being handled by our very capable Publicity Chairman, Ramona Gauthier. We grew from a very humble beginning to an organization of which we are very proud. We now have approximately 100 clubs. The history of this will be in our Souvenir Program which will be distributed free at the Golden State Round-Up.

It has come to our attention that some of the clubs are still practicing the old habit of banner snatching. As far back as September 1960 this Association went on record as being opposed to banner snatching. This is in our Standing Rules of which all club delegates have a copy. Some club banners are quite expensive and could be damaged or soiled which would cause the club an additional expense of restoring it to its original condition.

In order to stop this practice of banner snatching this Association came up with a Golden Buckskin. The Buckskin is a piece of deer hide with the N.C.S.D.A. initials branded on it. It travels from club to club. Each club which receives it gets to brand their club name on it and when it is full, the club which has its name on it the most gets to keep it for good. The rules for claiming it are briefly:

The first Club with two complete squares to arrive at the host Club wearing square dance clothes and their club badges may claim it after dancing at least two tips.

It must be displayed at all workshops and hoedowns.

The Club who holds the skin may display it beside their banner at all N.C.S.D.A. functions.

Each time a Club has the skin they should burn their club brand on it immediately because if another club should come to claim it and your brand is not on it you will have lost the opportunity to do so.

The brand or name must not be larger than 3 inches.

The skin can only be claimed once a night.

It is the responsibility of each club who has this Buckskin to notify the District Director that they have it. As of this writing (Jan. 26) it is being held by the Buzzin' Cuzzins of El Cerrito.

We felt sure that some of you did not know or had forgotten all about this Golden Buckskin. We hope by bringing this to your attention it will create a little more travel interest between the clubs.

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

Dear Editor:

In regard to Carl Chlesinger's letter printed in the January issue of "Square Dance-Where?", I am happy to be chosen as the one to answer and do hope I can give the information needed to Mr. Chlesinger, as well as to any other person who may feel has the same problems.

Mr. Chlesinger stated that "we graduated in May 1970. So we are intermediates and no longer beginners."

No. 1: Never feel that you are really in any classification, Square dancing is for fun. Never feel that you can't join in and help any beginner class along. By going, you will meet the finest people in Square Dancing and the most enthusiastic ones. Thus by helping someone else, you will learn all the newer calls too.

Most of the Beginner Classes begin in September, being that it is now March, these "Beginners" have been dancing for six months. Don't you really think this group would be the ideal spot for you to step into to have fun? I know our "Beginning Class" is really moving along and to dance with them you don't realize they are what we classify as "Beginners".

Mr. Chlesinger also stated, "We came to the decision that we needed workshop practice. We attended two workshops and it was a disaster!"

No. 2: This is what workshops are for. You might call them disaster areas. If there

are calls that you do not understand, ask the Caller to run you through them. This is what he is being paid for and really, it makes the Callers feel good to know that they are really needed and are of assistance. Actually, your dancing ability reflects on your Callers teaching and, of course, he wants you to know the calls.

If you should be one who is timid, fine - at the end of the tip go up and introduce yourself to the caller (if he doesn't know you) and tell him where you are having trouble. You not only will learn what you don't know, but you will make a new friend too. By doing this you may also be helping others who are too timid to ask too - thus you are saving dancers. You know communication is a must in Square Dancing, not only to you but from the Caller to the Dancers, and the Dancers to the Dancers working together as a team of eight.

Don't feel because you make a few mistakes that it is a disaster. Even the best dancers can pull the greatest goofs. This is where the fun comes in. To Square Dance, I believe you must first be able to laugh at yourself for the goofs you pull and especially at the goofs your spouse makes. Never criticize, none of us are perfect and there is always a new call to learn. It's a never ending battle challenging yourself to the music as well as the Caller.

Laughter is a catching thing, if you smile - no matter what you are doing (dancing or goofing) so will the other seven. Thus making fun for eight.

Needless to say we have people where dancing comes easy - and they are beautiful on the floor. Then we have others, like myself, who go through Beginner Classes every year, and can still pull the biggest goofs. There are two of us in our Club who

fit this classification, but even tho' Norma goofs more than me, I don't know who has more fun!

Getting back to serious thinking, Mr. Chlesinger, I did try to phone you and were unable to find your number. If at any time we can be of assistance, each month in "Square Dance-Where?" is a list of all the officers of Northern California Square Dancers Association, their address, and phone number. Just look us up and give us a call, we will be more than happy to be of assistance to give you the information which you need. Our main interest is to further Square Dancing - to have fun!

Bud passed away suddenly on February 1st. Bud had been the Caller for the Belmont Clodhoppers for a number of years and was indeed one of the most popular Area callers.

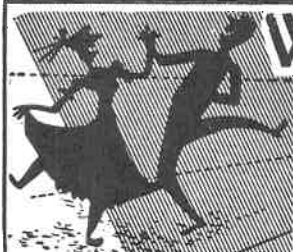
