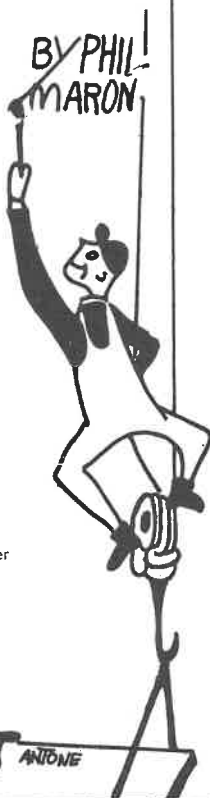

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

Dear Editor:

On December 5th, 1970, our club experienced a "banner snatching" which we hope was an individual act, not condoned by the membership of the individual's club. We queried many people concerning its whereabouts. We expected to be notified by those having the banner but this wasn't done voluntarily. Perhaps they didn't realize that the one person who saw them walk out with it didn't know them by name or club.

During the week of January 17-23 the banner was located. We requested it be returned and it was. Unfortunately the banner had been exposed to water, causing fading of colors and shrinkage of material. The portion damaged had just been attached to our banner the very day it was snatched. Considerable time and effort had been expended by several ladies of our club, obtaining matching material and making this portion which contained our caller's name. We resent very much, this disregard for property, time, effort and the feelings of others. It seems so sad that individual acts of carelessness can wipe out the time and efforts of many, devoted to the promotion of square dancing and good will.

We relate this incident not to seek revenge nor payment of any kind for the apparent damage to our banner. It isn't new nor expensive but does have sentimental value. We relate this with the hope that square dancers contemplating such an act will realize the folly of doing so. We ask those who engage in this practice to limit their activity to traveling banners. If square dancers will do this perhaps something other than hurt feelings will emerge from these little episodes."
