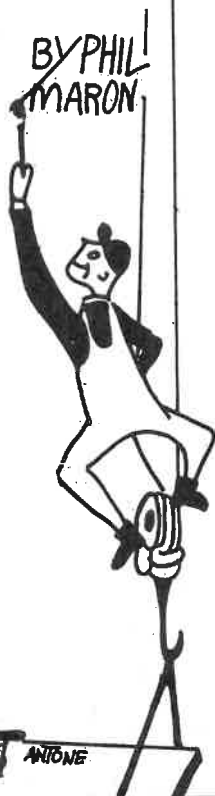

SPOTLIGHT ON THE *SQUARE CUTTERS*

The Square Cutters Club came into existence in July, 1948. The club was started by caller Jack McKay with approximately thirty-two members. Through Jack's patience and teaching of figures and calls, the Square Cutters dance their way into many functions. Jack stayed with the Square Cutters for many years, and it became known as a "family club" because of their friendliness, congeniality and good dancing.

Approximately three years ago, Jack McKay, because of outside commitments, had to give up calling for the Square Cutters.

Today, after twenty-three years of being the same "family club" we have a membership of outgoing people who enjoy square dancing and good fun. We were fortunate to have Don Shotwell consent to be our caller when Jack left. Don has done an outstanding job and the Square Cutters are most appreciative of his services. We now dance at the Lakeshore School on Thursday evenings from 8:15 to 10:15 p.m. Come dance with us soon.



WHO EVER HEARD OF A SQUARE DANCE CALLER WITH NO VOCAL CHORDS ??

To our way of thinking, Al St. Germain, of the Sonoma Grape Stompers, should be honored as the Caller of the Month after the benefit dance held for the American Cancer Society April 17, 1971. This was the first fun hoedown of the club, and the biggest and most successful hoedown ever held in Sonoma Valley.

The huge Veteran's Memorial Building in Sonoma was jammed to capacity and the crowd was electrified when Al St. Germain, President of the Sonoma Valley Branch of The American Cancer Society and himself a victim of throat cancer which resulted in no vocal chords, successfully called the first square dance without a voice box. Without question this is a new first for square dancing.

Four years ago Al became a victim of throat cancer, resulting in the loss of his larynx. Following this came the struggle for a second voice, a process which requires learning to draw air into the esophagus and produce sound by expelling the air. The trick is to learn to articulate the sound in spoken words by control of the throat muscles and use of the tongue and lips. This requires 8 to 10 hours practice a day for months before clear speech is developed.

Being an electronic engineer, with years of experience in transmitting sound by radio, Al helped perfect the pneumatic aid he now uses; it's use being primarily for amplification.

Al devotes most of his time to tutoring individuals who have lost their voice, making regular visits to throat cancer patients in hospitals before and after their operation to give encouragement. He is also active in the International Association of Laryngectomees and provides lectures for university and medical groups. This outstanding individual says he took up square dancing last September primarily as a means of helping those about to become voiceless. He says that when he tells a patient he is doing everything he did before the operation and is now square dancing, the patient's eyes light up with new hope and determination to overcome their misfortune.

Al's decision to learn to square dance was the result of a facetious remark made to Ken Rickert, Sonoma Grape Stompers' club caller, who immediately saw the possibilities of using it as the first hoedown of the club. Working with Bonnie Hurd, local square dance record distributor who developed the calls, Al's calling was a success from the start. Keep it up Al - Square Dancing needs you.
