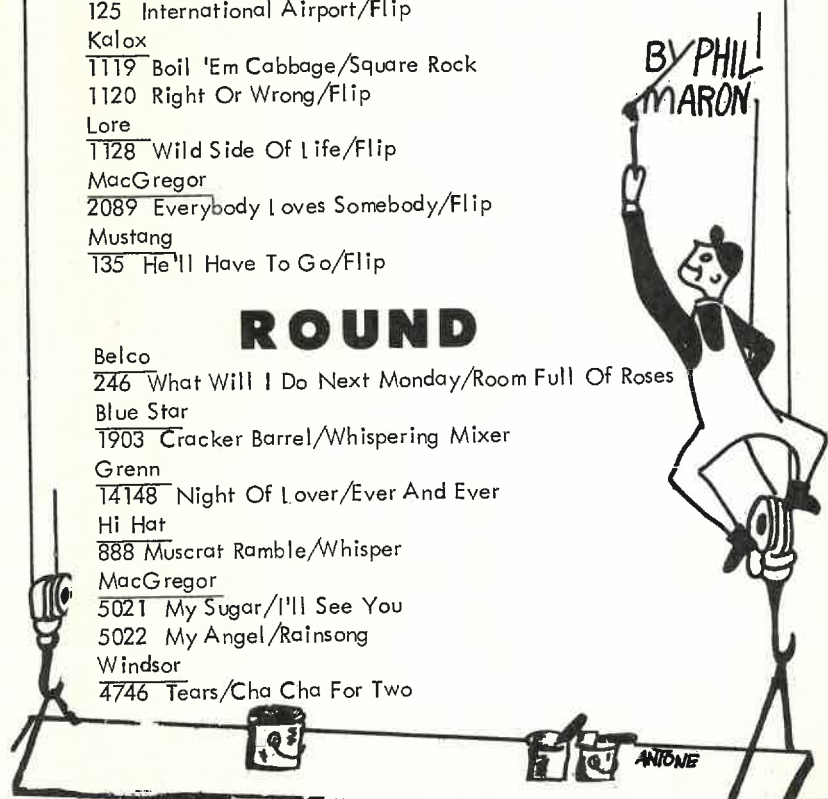

When I was asked to write an informative article on "Mr. Square Dance Where?", I felt like a cat turned loose in the canary factory - there is SO much I could write. However, this being a family magazine and all, I'm forced to keep it factual and friendly.

Let's start with a little personal history. Although Ed has spent most of his life (Man! That takes in a lot of history) in the Bay Area, our hero was actually born as Edward Walter Ferrario in Ft. Worth, Texas, around the time of Wyatt Earp. Texas, of course, is nothing but miles and miles of miles and miles, which is probably where Edward Walter gets his leaning toward bigness.

He married his lovely and intelligent wife BETTY, in Alameda in 1937, (SOMEBODY has to have it in each family!) and shortly afterwards went off to another war, (known as WW II). He served in the Army Engineers in the Phillipines and New Guinea. (He was captured by headhunters, who turned him back because nobody would have believed their trophy anyway). Having won the war, he went to work for the City of Alameda in 1951, where he is now employed as Deputy Assessor. His current hobbies are swimming (he can't sink) and lately he has become fascinated by bonsai, the art of growing trees and shrubs in pots, and dwarfing and shaping them by various methods. He has almost fifty trees and plants to date.

His main love, of course, is square dancing. He has been calling since 1950, and was one of the founders of the Square Devils, which started in Alameda. He started calling for the Alameda Wagon Wheelers, the oldest club in Alameda, in May, 1951, and because of the clever way he wrote the original contract, has been their caller ever since. In 1954, he was appointed to take over the struggling little 32-page magazine "Square Dance-Where?" and has remained as editor - and everything else - since that time. The 32 pages have grown to anywheres from 64 to 80 pages, and has become as necessary to the square dancer as his boots - or her petticoats. Ed has been Program Chairman for the Golden State Round-Up four different times - including once for yours truly - and will undoubtedly be called on future occasions.

He originated and produced the big, free Souvenir Programs, three different editions of which have been given away at various Golden State Round-Ups, and which contain and up-date the history of the NCSDA. He has also published Dan and Madeline Allen's "Squaredancemanship".

In 1964 Ed started the "Stardettes", a teen-age exhibition group (there is a real generation gap) and continues to be their coach, choreographer, and caller. They have appeared at every Golden State Round-Up since, as well as at the National in Seattle, the Harvest Hoedown in Sacramento, and the Monterey Festival. They plan on attending the Far Western in Oregon in 1972 and Utah in 1973.

He was Caller of the Year for 1970 and has received so many trophies and plaudits for being helpful and competent and willing and nice that I think I am going to be sick. I hate people like that!

BILL JONAS TELLS IT LIKE IT IS IN NEW ZEALAND

New Zealand is probably one of the most beautiful countries in the whole world. To refresh your memory, it consists of two islands south of the Equator some 1200 miles east of Australia. The people are friendly, generous, and most kind to the visitor and newcomer. The majority of the people are Anglo-Saxon descent and about one-quarter of the population consists of the Maori people who settled these islands hundreds of years ago coming from other South Pacific islands. Except that the seasons are reversed, the climate and geography here is much like the Pacific Coast of the United States. Auckland on the north tip of North Island is much like Los Angeles while Wellington on the south tip of North Island is much like San Francisco. South Island is much like Oregon, Washington, and British Columbia with many evergreen forests and high snow-capped mountains.

Like in the United States, Square Dancing has gone through two major phases. First, ten or twelve years ago, square dancing was quite popular, but it was of the "old fashion" traveling couple type. That seemed to die out in popularity. Then about six years ago Art Shepherd, a native New Zealander, returned, after a long stay in Canada, to introduce Modern American Square Dancing. For at least four and a half years he fought an uphill battle calling six nights a week to groups of two or three squares and training callers on the side. Today, Square Dancing is going full bloom in Dunedin, Christchurch, and Auckland, with a large record group in the Hawke's Bay Area. When Art learned that I was coming to New Zealand and settling in the Wellington Area, he was most happy and very encouraging in his many letters to me - because there was little or no square dancing being done there.

Well, I have been here four months, and it has been a struggle to establish two beginning classes, but we do have one group

dancing three squares in downtown Wellington and three squares in the suburb of Upper Hutt, and the one record club has asked me to come and call "live" to their three squares. To start all this, several hundreds of dollars had to be spent on newspaper advertising, but little-by-little square dancing is growing in the Wellington area. It takes time for the New Zealanders to join in... they tend to be a bit conservative about taking an "active part" in anything, but, once introduced, they go, go, go.

Up in Auckland, Dennis Spackman has fifteen squares in his beginners class and ten squares in his regular club...by the way, Dennis is a medical doctor with his own clinic and full practice. Art has three groups dancing in Christchurch, but is turning one over to a younger caller he has trained. The festivals and conventions held from time to time bring in fifteen to twenty squares—at a very nominal fee—but all the spirit and fellowship of the activity is there.

Although the Hawke's Bay group has been dancing to tapes and records for some time, they are all looking forward to the coming of Russ Ainsworth from Seattle who is also migrating to this country to teach school and call squares. As an aside, every once in a while we get a letter from an American caller who wants to make a tour of New Zealand and would like to be booked for a number of nights at \$100 per night. We read such letters and smile—I collect about \$10 each night I call and then pay \$7.50 for hall rent, then drive 20 miles home...at the Easter Festival in Hastings, Art and I were happy to have our motel bills paid...but we enjoyed calling for three days.

It is suggested to callers that they arrange a tour, come on down with a group as a leader, and simply enjoy the experience of world travel and pleasurable calling. My good friend, John Campbell, recently came through with such a square dance group, and the folks down here are still talking about it. One or two other major American callers have led tours to these wonderful isles, and everybody is always welcome. Most of the New Zealand square dancers have danced to the recorded voices of many American callers, and they hunger for a personal appearance.

The spirit of square dancing is really strong here; yet can you believe that there are NO square dance shops (all the women

make their own dresses and everything - including their partner's shirts) and there are NO record shops to sell square dance records...they cost about \$3 each coming from the States. (JIM HILTON provided me with a few hundred records from Bay Area callers which are being distributed among the callers and clubs about the country). And, for the twinkle-toes, yes, there is Round Dancing here - and - several outstanding teachers to present it to everyone. In conclusion, please let me say that the first time I ever called in New Zealand, I looked out on the floor and was able to say to myself, "I never left home."

Mr. GUBSER introduced the following joint resolution; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

JOINT RESOLUTION

Designating the square dance as the national folk dance of the United States of America.

Whereas love of country and professions is enhanced by traditions that have become a part of our way of life and the customs of the American people; and

Whereas we have distinctive and meaningful symbols of our ideals in our Nation's flag, our national anthem, and in many cultural endeavors, but no official designation of a national folk dance; and

Whereas the square dance, which was first associated with the American people and recorded in history since 1651, has consistently been the one dance traditionally recognized by the American people as a dignified and enjoyable expression of American folk dancing; and

Whereas official recognition of the square dance will enhance the cultural stature of the United States, both nationally and internationally; and

Whereas national and international prestige is in the best interest of all Americans: Now, therefore, be it

- 1 *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*
- 2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
- 3 That the dance known as the square dance is designated
- 4 the national folk dance of the United States of America.

We hope that they are accurate, but we have no way or time to check on each one submitted." John Strong stated that the responsibility is on the Association not on the Editor. We should give Ed a vote of confidence and rely on his judgment as Editor.

President Kadish asked "Will someone write a letter to the Editor about ads that are exaggerating the facts?"

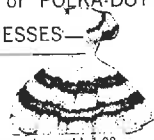

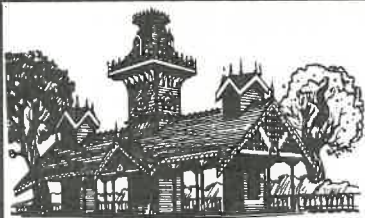

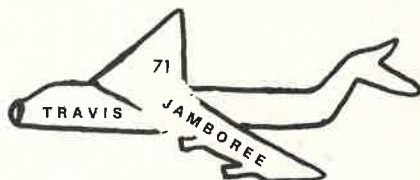
