POSITION: Open-fcg M fcg wall for INTRO; Bfly M fcg wall for DANCE

FOOTWORK: Opposite; directions for M except as noted

MEASURES:

INTRODUCTION

1 - 4 (1)WAIT; (2)WAIT; (3)APART, POINT, -; (4)TOGETHER (to Bfly) TOUCH, -;

1-2 In Open-fcg pos M fcg wall wait 2 meas;;

3-4 Step apt on L, point R twd ptr, -; Step tog on R to BFLY, tch L, -;

DANCE

1 - 4 (1)WALTZ AWAY; (2)WALTZ TOG (CP M fcg wall); (3)DIP BACK, -,-; (MANUV, 2, 3;

1 Turn to OP as you waltz fwd LOD & diag away L, R, L;

2 Waltz fwd & diag tog to CP M fcg wall R, L, R;

3 In CP dip bwd twd COH on L, -,- (hold 2 cts);

4 Starting R M maneuver 1/4 RF R, L, R to end CP M fcg RLOD;

5 - 8 (5)BACK, DRAW, CLOSE; (6)BACK, DRAW, CLOSE; (7)R TURN WALTZ; (8) TURN WALTZ;

5 In canter rhythm M steps back LOD on L, draw R to L, close on R;

6 Repeat Meas 5;

7-8 Start bwd on M's L do 2 RF turning waltzes L, R, L; R, L, R end BFLY;

9 - 16 (9)WALTZ AWAY; (10)WALTZ TOG (CP M fcg wall); (11)DIP BK, -,-; (12) MANUV, 2, 3; (13)BACK, DRAW, CLOSE; (14)BACK, DRAW, CLOSE; (15)R TURN WALTZ; (16)R TURN WALTZ;

Repeat action of Meas 1-8.

17 - 20 (17)FWD WALTZ; (18)FWD FACE, SIDE, CLOSE; (19)TWINKLE THRU; (20)TWINKLE THRU;

17 Turn to OP waltz fwd LOD L, R, L;

18 Waltz fwd on R to face ptr, side on L, close R to L change hands;

19 Swinging joined M's L & W's R hands thru twd RLOD twinkle thru down RLOD

M's L XIF (W's R XIF), side on R face ptr, close L to R change hands;

20 Swinging joined M's R & W's L hands thru twd LOD twinkle thru down LOD M's

R SIF (W's L XIF), side on L, face ptr close R to L to OP;

21-24 (21)FWD WALTZ; (22)FWD FAC, SIDE, CLOSE; (23)TWINKLE THRU; (24)TWINKLE THRU (SCP);

Repeat action of Meas 17-20 -- EXCEPT -- end in SCP-fcg LOD.

25-28 (25)STEP, SWING, -; (26)BACK PICKUP, TCH, -; (27)L TURN WALTZ; (28)L TURN WALTZ;

25 In SCP fcg LOD step fwd on L, swing R fwd, -;

26 M steps back on R (as W steps fwd on L turning 1/2 LF to face ptr in CP), tch L beside R, -;

27 CP step fwd L turning 1/4 LF to face COH, step side R turning 1/4 LF to face RLOD, close L to R;

28 Step back twd LOD on R turning 1/4 LF to face wall, step side L, close R to L ending CP M fcg wall;

29-32 (29) DIP BACK, -,-; (30)MANUV, 2, 3; (31)R TURN WALTZ; (32)WALTZ TWIRL;

29-30 Repeat action of Meas 3 & 4;

31 Starting bwd on M's L do a RF turning waltz L, R, L;

32 As M waltzes fwd LOD R, L, R (W twirls RF under the joined lead hands L, R, L)

to end in BFLY to start dance over;

SEQUENCE: INTRO - DANCE THRU TWICE - ENDING

ENDING: APART, POINT, HOLD.
