These are guideline Basics, and as always it is the Caller's good judgment to use them in a manner to keep everyone dancing.

1. Circle left and right
2. Walk (shuffle)
3. Forward and back
4. Honors
5. Dosado
6. Waist swing
7. Couple Promenade
8. Single file promenade
