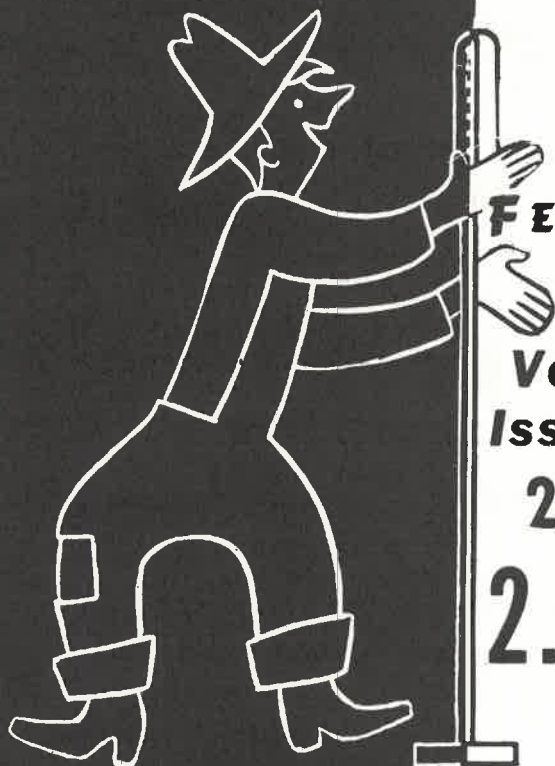

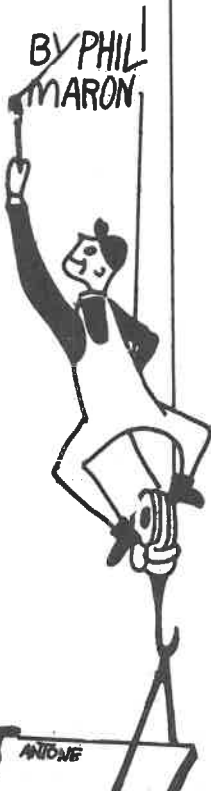

Items for "Square Dance-Where?" must be submitted well in advance of publication, so, when you don't see anything in this message about the Anniversary Dance please bear in mind that it hadn't taken place at the time of this writing. I am sure next months issue will contain many glowing reports on a job well done.

A few words about Beginner Classes; we have attended a couple of Beginner Hoedowns and feel that the Callers are doing a fine job of teaching and staying with the 75 basics. Try to keep your dancers in class until they are at ease with the material they are learning. Don't rush them out to dances that are beyond their abilities. It makes a new dancer feel real good to go to a dance and be able to do everything that is being called, it also shows him that his caller is doing a good job of teaching him to Square Dance. Taking newer dancers to an Intermediate dance often causes them to become discouraged and soon they start to talk about dropping out and many times they take others with them. Remember back when you started and how foreign all those calls sounded to you. Be patient and before you know it the classes will be over and you will have many fine dancers joining your clubs. Let's make everyone that started a class in '71 a dedicated Square Dancer for years to come.

Round-Up is just around the corner and we need the help of all the clubs to make this dance a success. Send in your selection slip for the committee you want to work with now. This year we will be using ribbons instead of badges as in previous years. This should eliminate a long line of people waiting at the Advance Registration Window because now when you send in for Advance Registration the ribbons will be sent to you by return mail. Watch the ads in "Square

Dance-Where?" for all the news of the Round-Up. There are a few other changes being discussed this year and we want everyone to know exactly what is going on and attending all the dance events. Be sure to contact your Delegate or District Director if you have any questions about your Association.
