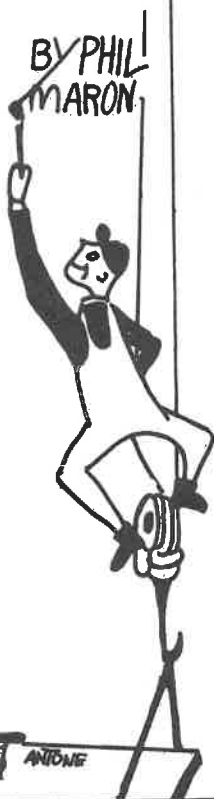

1-2.....In Open-fcg M's R & W's L hands joined M fcg wall & ptr wait 2 meas;;
3-4.....Standard ACK to SCP fcg LOD;;

- 1-4 (SCP)FWD TWO-STEP; FWD TWO-STEP; (Scoot);FWD,CLOSE,FWD,CLOSE; WALK,-;
FACE (CP),-;
1-2.....In SCP do 2 fwd two-steps LOD L,R,L,-; R,L,R,-;

'President's Message'

On January 9, over one hundred squares of dancers celebrated the twenty-first anniversary of the Northern California Square Dancers' Association; and it is worth noting that the success of the Anniversary Dance is symbolic of the success and progress of the Northern California square dancers since we first came together on January 7, 1951.

Starting with a nucleus of thirteen clubs representing 350 dancers we have created one of the most successful associations in the country with a membership of over one hundred clubs representing thousands of dancers as, over the years, we have worked together to make square dancing more interesting and more attractive to more people.

Very simply, your association is made up of square dancing clubs and each club's business relative to the entire membership is managed by your club representative known as the Delegate. The delegate is very important to you as a club member because he is the direct link between your club and your association and how well he does his job can largely determine the success of each.

It is the delegates' job to fully represent your club at the general committee meetings of the association and to keep your club fully informed concerning the affairs of the association. It is important then for your delegates to attend the club's board and general meetings in order to keep you fully informed concerning association business which affects you and to be fully aware of your wishes when he discusses and votes on square dance business at the general meeting. The delegates can also be asked to inform your newer dancers concerning the existence and role of the association and how it helps them as square dancers.

It requires a lot of work to be effective delegates; so when you find good delegates, keep them long enough to obtain maximum

effectiveness as your club representative. Remember that the success of the NCSDA and the progress of the square dance movement in Northern California depends a great deal on the success of your delegate in fully representing you, the dancer.

Square Dancers are SMART!

In 15 years of square dancing, I've yet to see a consistent square dancer who wasn't real sharp in the think department. They all have a high I.Q. Maybe they didn't all get to college, but they could have earned their B.A.'s if the opportunity had occurred. It strikes me that my square dancing acquaintances have an unusually high percentage of skilled artisans, teachers, technicians and professionals, with a good sprinkling of successful businessmen.

How come?

First off, square dancing is not like other forms of "dancing." A sense of rhythm is essential, but no natural graces or body skills are required (except in round dancing but that's a different matter). What is required is a subtle sense of where one is in time and space, in relation to seven other people. This is actually a mathematical skill. Square dancing is an application of plane geometry, for it requires that one be in the right place, at the right time, and facing the right direction - and all of this without depending very much on another's help.

Secondly, at today's pace, the dancer has to be able to store up the caller's instructions with his ears and brain, while his brain and feet are doing something else, and then he has to execute that instruction, while another complex command is entering his memory bank.

There's more!

Thirdly, and most importantly, he has to have memorized some 75 or more basic movements, and perhaps a dozen or more compound calls (like Tea-Cup Chain), and be ready to translate them into action at a moment's notice. Considering how similar some of the calls sound (about a dozen "Throughs" and almost as many "Chains", just for example), the ear and brain and feet and hands have to do a lot of fast and fancy sorting out, so that the body arrives at the

right place and the right time and the right direction.

These are real egghead skills! Many a ballroom dancer has exquisite timing and rhythm and grace, but those things don't take brains - not the kind of brains that square dancing requires. Sometimes it makes us look rather serious, and no wonder! An elderly friend, recalling the barn dances of his youth, asked me, "Don't you ever smile? Don't square dancers have fun any more?" I had to reassure him that we were having fun, but not necessarily because of high jinks and hilarity. Our fun lay in doing something so well, so fast and so smoothly that it didn't even look hard. Pshaw! we all have our laughs, when we goof and pick ourselves up and carry on in spite of the mistake. But those who look upon square dancing as we did barn dancing - as an occasion for whooping and hollering and beer-guzzling and low humor - they constitute only a tiny minority. They usually find themselves dancing only with others like themselves, or not at all.

Of course, there are smiles in square dancing. Think of all the parties where a Butch Carr or a Grant Nelson was present, making the caller laugh, as well as the dancers. Or remember the Institutions or Camps or Dance Weeks where everyone was able to follow the high-level stuff easily - plenty of laughs there, because good friends were enjoying the tremendous exhilaration of Hot Hash at full tilt, or because they were able to cut loose on "Colonel Bogey" or "The Battle of New Orleans", because it afforded that animal release of bodily pleasure that came with complete confidence in what the brain was carrying out subconsciously. Remember the glow at the end of each tip, as everyone said at once, "We have a good square," and meant it sincerely, for everyone was always at the right place at the right time, and facing the right direction.

It's a compliment to all of us, that no matter how fiendishly clever the callers get, the dedicated dancers will be able to do their bidding - perhaps a mite smugly, because their brains were capable of giving their spirits and their bodies that wonderful "lift" that comes from really "knowing" how. I hope all our new dancers will quickly reach those heights of pleasure at their new-found recreation. IT'S WONDERFUL!
