This year we are introducing a few new ideas to the Round-Up, and as with progress, we will try them in hopes that they will be beneficial to the Dancer.

At this time we especially want everyone to know about some special people who have been near and dear to us in the Square Dance World. In fact, they were part of the Delegates who voted Don and I in as Directors of the 5th District many years ago, giving us our first step to work with the NCSDA Board. These people always work quietly in the background, never in the spotlight, and whenever you ask for their help, they do a great job.

We can't thank Delbert and Florence Ross and Tom and Darlene Pickrell enough. They have been diligently working along with our theme for two years - or more . . . Needless to say, Delbert and Florence are our Decoration Chairman, and Tom and Darlene are their Assistants. We hope everyone really notices the decorations - and do look these four people up and thank them for beautifying the hall for our enjoyment. Here's your chance to really meet some extra special Square Dancers - and after you meet them, you'll understand why. This is not the first year these couples have worked on the Round-Up for our enjoyment, and I understand it won't be the last one either. Please say thank you to them, as

they do mean very much to us.

This month's visitation to the different Areas and Clubs has been fun. Everywhere I've gone, it has been most receptive and I've really had a good time. I still say, no one has more fun than Square Dancers!

Our Association met with the Santa Clara Square Dance Association and we exchanged ideas with one another. NCSDA meets with them annually each year, always having a good constructive meeting followed with a delicious pot-luck dinner. They were beautiful hosts and we had a great time, topped off with excellent Square Dancing.

Many of the Clubs have been asking about the coverage we carry through NCSDA for our Clubs, so we hope the following information will be helpful to you:

The Association has Liability Insurance to cover each Club and each Club Member to a maximum of \$200,000 for one person and \$500,000 for any one accident in so far as bodily injury is concerned; \$25,000 per accident for property damage and \$100,000 Fire Legal Liability Insurance.

The Liability Insurance is to cover if any Club, or Club Member, is found to be legally guilty of an act that caused bodily injury or property damage while the Club, or Club Member, is doing something on behalf of/ or for the Club. In other words the Club, or Club Member, would have to do something to cause the accident, i.e. put speed-up on the floor to make the floor so slippery that someone fell.

The injured party could then submit a claim for their bodily injury, and if it was proven that there was negligence on the part of the Club, or Club Member, the Insurance Company would pay the claim.

The Fire Legal Liability is to cover a Club or its Club Members if they were to cause a fire. For example, a Club rents a hall, they plug in their own Club coffee pot that causes an electrical short and as a result of this electrical short - the building burns down. The building owners Insurance Company rebuilds the building, then that Insurance Company goes after the Club to get their money back. Our Square Dancers Insurance Policy would pay this claim if it were proven that the Club's coffee pot was the cause of the fire.

At the present time, our Association is working with the Teen Clubs. As you know, we have many Teen Clubs joining our Association, and they do want to work in some

way with the Board. Since nothing is definite right now as to what action will be taken, no more shall be said, but we do want you, the Dancer, to know the Association has been working on this for a few months already, and I am sure the final outcome will be a good one for the betterment of square dancing.

As I stated before, it does take a lot of long hours and hard work for the many individuals who represent you on the Board and I do hope all your Clubs do recognize these people when they take their time to visit your club and hoedown. These people are devoted Square Dancers, who receive no pay, but work hard for their "Love for Square Dancing".

Through the years there were many times when we thought, "Is it really worth all of this giving of time and patience?" but all you have to do is: Go to a Hoedown, sit on the side lines, and see everyone enjoying themselves. Then you do realize and feel great knowing that you are part of the ground work to enable these people to have so much fun. So please, as members, be aware of who is visiting your Club, and please introduce them . . . they deserve it! Remember, "WORK IS A LABOR OF LOVE!"
