Footwork: Opposite, Directions for M except as noted.

INTRO: ((Open-Facing) WAIT; WAIT; APART, POINT, -; TOG (to Bfly), TOUCH, -;

1-4 In Open-Facing pos M facing wall wait 2 Meas then do a standard Intro ending in Butterfly pos with M still facing wall;

DANCE

(1)(Bfly) TWIRL-VINE, 2, 3; (2)(Twk) THRU, SIDE, CLOSE; (3) THRU, SIDE, CLOSE; (4) MANUV, 2, 3;

- 1 Starting from Butterfly pos and moving LOD the W twirls R-face under lead hands as the M vines LOD swd L, cross R behind, swd L;
- 2 Cross thru twd LOD on R (both XIF), swd LOD on L, close R; (* See Note)
- 3 Cross thru twd RLOD on L (both XIF), swd RLOD on R, close L;
- 4 M maneuvers 1/4 R-face around W (R, L, close R) & end in CP with M's bk to LOD;

(5) WALTZ TURN R; (6) FWD WALTZ; (7) PROG TWINKLE; (8) PROG TWINKLE (to Bfly);

- 5 Starting bwd twd LOD on L waltz turn R-face a 1/2 turn (L, R, close L);
- 6 In CP waltz fwd LOD R, L, close R;
- 7 Cross L over R (W XIB) to Sidecar and step diag twd wall & LOD on L, fwd R, close L and turn to face LOD;
- 8 Cross R over L (W XIB) to Banjo and step diag COH & LOD on R, fwd L turning to face partner, close R and end in Butterfly pos with M facing wall;

(9)(Bfly) TWIRL-VINE, 2, 3; (10)(Twk) THRU, SIDE, CLOSE; (11) THRU, SIDE, CLOSE; (12) MANUV, 2, 3;

9-12 Repeat the action of Meas 1 thru 4;

(13) WALTZ TURN; (14) FWD WALTZ; (15) PROG TWINKLE; (16) PROG TWINKLE (to Bfly);

13-16 Repeat the action of Meas 5 thru 8;

(17)(Bfly) WALTZ BAL L; (18) SIDE (to SCP), ROCK BK, RECOV; (19) CHANGE SIDES, 2, 3;

(20)(Face) SIDE, TOUCH, -;

- 17 In Butterfly pos step short step swd LOD on L, cross R slightly in back of L, recov wt in place on L (waltz balance);
- 18 Step swd RLOD on R while turning to SCP facing LOD, rock bwd twd RLOD on L, recover fwd on R;
- 19 Change sides while moving fwd LOD with W moving under joined lead hands L, R, L ending in L-Open pos facing LOD & starting to blend to face partner;
- 20 Face partner and step swd LOD on R, touch L to R, hold in Butterfly pos;

(21)(Bfly) WALTZ BAL L; (22) SIDE (to SCP), ROCK BK, RECOV; (23) CHANGE SIDES, 2, 3;

(24)(Face) SIDE, TOUCH, -;

21-24 Starting from outside and progressing RLOD repeat the action of Meas 17 thru 20 and end starting blend to SCP;

(25)(SCP) FWD WALTZ; (26) STEP, SWING, -; (27) BACK (face), SIDE, CLOSE; (28) SIDE, TOUCH, -;

- 25 Blend to SCP and waltz fwd LOD L, R, close L;
- 26 Step fwd LOD on R, swing L slightly fwd (low with toe pointed), hold 1 ct;
- 27 Step bwd RLOD on L & turn to face partner, swd on R, close L to R;
- 28 Swd RLOD on R, touch L, hold 1 ct;

(29)(CP) DIP BACK, TOUCH, -; (30) MANUV, 2, 3; (31) WALTZ TURN; (32) WALTZ TURN (to Bfly);

- 29 In Closed pos dip bwd twd COH on L, touch R, hold 1 ct;
- 30 Waltz turn 1/4 R-fc R, L, close R to end in CP with M's back to COH;
- 31-32 Starting bwd twd LOD on L do a 3/4 R-fc turn in 2 waltzes and end blending to Butterfly pos with M's back to COH;

DANCE GOES THRU TWO & HALF TIMES

Ending: On last time thru in MEAS 16 the W twirls R-face almost in place as the M completes his twinkle then change hands & acknowledge as music ends.

NOTE: The choreographers keep the M's L hand & W's R joined throughout the dance including the twinkles in Meas 2 & 3. However, dancers may switch hands on the twinkles if they are more comfortable in doing so.
