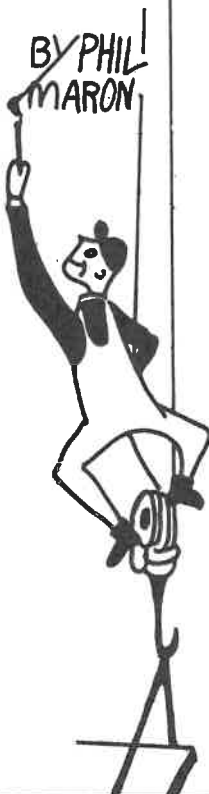

'President's Message'

Greetings to our fellow square dancers.

You have probably already noted that we have back-to-back stampedes during this period. We had a very enjoyable one last month with some of our fine local callers handling the program; and another is scheduled for next month featuring some well-known and well-liked out-of-area callers. This should be a real good dance and we suggest you get your membership cards early.

For the benefit of our more recent members, we will give a little of the background and general information concerning the dancers association stampedes. To some of our older members, this will seem painfully elementary but we hope you will bear with us.

The stampedes are held on a fifth Saturday and there are usually three held - spaced geographically so as to be easily accessible to as many members as possible. Association members only may attend a stampede - this is one of the tangible benefits of belonging. However, if you have dancer friends visiting who live and dance outside our association boundaries, contact your District Director, either through your Delegate or directly, for permission to purchase a card for said friends.

Generally, the calling program is alternated between local callers and out-of-area callers. Suggestions are periodically received from our members that only out-of-area callers be hired, but the executive board executes stampede policy set by the general committee and the general committee instituted the formula of alternating the calling program some years ago.

A survey was made at the stampede in April to ascertain dancer preference with regard to stampede policy, but the results were not very conclusive. About half of those who took part in the survey favored local callers and the other half preferred out-of-area callers. Perhaps this is a vindication of present policy. The survey did

indicate a definite and strong desire to continue the association stampedes on the fifth Saturday as well as approval of the newly instituted pre-round program at our stampedes.

In closing, we emphasize that no one regards the stampede as a perfect program incapable of improvement. Any suggestions you might have would be greatly appreciated. Just drop Billie and me a card or letter. If you'd rather not, then give it to your Delegate or District Director to take to the board or general committee meeting.
