WHAT ABOUT THE KIDS?

We middle-age types dominate Square Dancing, though we do have a sprinkling of teen clubs. Looking back, there was a time when more pre-teens were active in the movement, and it was a frequent part of the scene to have a sort of junior section in many clubs, and in many schools, square dancing was part of the recreation program. We should see more of the kids.

There are plenty of problems. With the teens, the constant shifting in "boy-girl" relationships is a cause of many drop-outs. If a boy loses his dancing girl-friend to a non-dancer, it usually means both dancers are lost to the club. But this is not a hazard with pre-teens.

Pre-teens don't need "couple" status to enjoy a boy-girl activity. Quite the opposite - they are quite willing to enjoy an evening for friendship alone, if everyone is having fun. What can we older enthusiasts

do to bring our wonderful hobby to the young people? Well, schools are the place where we find the pre-teens already grouped together for learning, and for group fun, so there is our best bet. We should give our thoughts and time to help the kids enjoy couple contacts, without the mature linking of one boy to one girl as in ballroom dancing. In square dancing, the emphasis is on the group of eight in the square, even though the participants are temporarily linked as couples. The atmosphere promotes the social graces, since each must be considerate of a partner, and of the other six in the square. Each is impelled to do his part, for the good of the others, rather than just for his own pleasure. The old-fashioned nature of square dancing promotes gentility - bowing gracefully, swinging a partner smoothly, holding hands in a way to help guide a partner through a maneuver, and gentleness to avoid bumping and other roughness - all these are the virtues of modern square dancing. It has come a long way from the "barn dance!" of our youth, yet it has an enthusiasm that is generated by the catchy beat of the music.

Another great virtue of square dancing is that it teaches co-ordination in a mathematical sort of way. Some have called it dancing to "plane geometry", because of the prescribed movements on the floor. It is not "footwork", as in ballroom dancing, but "headwork." To fully enjoy square dancing, is to arrive at the proper place, at the proper time, facing the proper direction. With a little persuasion from the instructor, a child will see the beauty of such precision, just as in drill teams, and this sense of orderliness is good for a background in other school activities. There is no place in modern square dancing for rowdiness, but while a child is learning the precision-work needed, he is also having a lot of fun. We have all danced enough with youngsters to know how seriously they take their role, but how happy they are to be in with the adults, and able to enjoy a joint recreation.

We must help interested teachers learn how to instruct in square dancing. There are callers and other enthusiastic dancers who are only waiting for the chance to do this. All of us should do our bit to encourage school-boards and school principals to include square dancing in the schools' "rec." program.

get much out of mere "exercise" for its own sake. There are many who can't do well in sports. Many of these two groups would benefit enormously from a square dance program at school. As a physician, I see too much emphasis on exercise as a body-builder. Millions of us get through life nicely with activities that are a part of something else, like gardening or similar hobbies, because our ancestors bequeathed us a physique unsuited for vigorous muscular activity. We gain but little from being forced to do exercises, and partake in contact sports, because our bodies really don't need those activities. The John F. Kennedy types do need it, and benefit from it, but too many others would not. The latter need activities such as square dancing or bowling, where head-work can make one a success. To insist on bodily exercise for them just "turns them off," and they lose the chance to learn bodily co-ordination. This is where square dancing would help most in the school-child.

An appealing thing about square dancing is that there is virtually no expense to it. The schools all have PA systems. A borrowed turntable and a few inexpensive records are all the equipment needed. The children don't have to buy any special equipment or clothes or shoes. The schools' gym or all-purpose room provides the instruction area. All we need is some leadership to help the teachers learn just enough to teach the simple figures that are the basics of the dance. The children will be the big beneficiaries, for they will absorb body-skills that will help them all through life. And best of all, they will be able to square dance long after the age of which they can be accomplished at any sport - into their 70's and 80's, even!

SQUARE DANCING IN THE SCHOOLS

Square dancing should be in our schools. It is fun, and this factor alone makes it worthy of consideration in any school's program. But, there are other, and more important, educational benefits that adhere to a school system including a well operated square dance program in their curriculum.

Listening and reacting properly to what is heard is a difficult skill to teach in the classroom. Yet, failure to listen and comprehend is a common cause of at least some failures. Those of us who square dance know

only too well the necessity of listening, and transferring what is heard into action without much hesitation. The failure to hear, comprehend and react has immediate and disastrous results. Square dancing, preferably with a caller, develops good listening habits in children quicker and easier than any other single technique available to the classroom teacher.

Not only do good listening habits carry over to the classroom, but left to right progression, so necessary in reading and related activities, is easily and firmly implanted into habit through the responses to the caller's directions.

This left and right awareness, in conjunction with the other exercises in timing and coordination developed through square dancing, are a very distinct asset to the teacher of the educationally handicapped, in particular, those who have dyslexia and related problems.

The close attention that must be paid to the business at hand in square dancing is reflected in the classroom in longer attention spans, and closer attention to detail in classroom work. Also, the self-discipline which develops within the square carries over to the classroom. Some may scoff at square dancing being an aid to school room discipline, but we have seen it work too often to doubt it.

Very often the child who cannot excel in athletics, or other areas of school life will find success through square dancing and help build his self-esteem. He learns that his own individual efforts contribute to the success of a group activity, and he learns to work with many other people toward a common goal, even those he may not particularly like.

There are too many other advantages to a school system that includes square dancing to mention here, except for one more. Children who square dance will stay in contact with a wide group of the nicest, most friendly people we know, square dancers, and through their interest and this contact, develop one more defence against drugs, wilder associates and some of the other excesses that have put youth in the news all too often.

Are your children enjoying the benefits of a good square dance program in your school? We are at East Lake!
