October is a beautiful month in Northern California - it is also the month when many people become acquainted with square dancing for the first time at one of the many classes sponsored by our club members. As square dancers, we invest a great deal of time and effort in these classes because they are important to us. Because of this interest, we will present some ideas we have heard and thought about concerning these classes in the hope they may have some value.

The first item for your consideration is a change of name for our classes. Traditionally, a class has been known as "beginner square dance class". Perhaps it should be called a "modern square dance class" instead since the word "modern" represents a truer picture of today's square dance scene and too, after the initial lesson, a couple, technically, are no longer beginners. The name change might also help our recruiting activities by placing the invitation to potential members on a more attractive and dignified basis.

Another item which affects our classes is the agreement between your dancers' association and the callers' association which establishes 75-basics as the standard for the graduation of square dance class members to the rank of club members. It is in the best interest of club members sponsoring a square dance class to insist that each graduating couple be not merely exposed but possess a definite proficiency at executing each of the 75-basics prior to graduating. This would not only benefit the square dance clubs and make Saturday night dances more enjoyable but would serve to enhance the reputation of your club, your caller, and the individual dancer.

Another important point to consider is the practice of club members allowing - and, in some cases, taking - dance class members to attend Saturday night intermed-

iate level dances prior to graduation. In addition to marring the fun of intermediate dancers who are attending the dance, the class member is often discouraged to the point of discontinuing square dancing. At the least, the carefully nurtured enthusiasm and interest of the class member couple by the caller-instructor has been blunted and his job is made more difficult.

Finally, when the class members graduate and join the club, they are treated as first-class members. Of course, the simple act of graduating did not make them intermediate dancers and the learning process will continue until they are dancing at club level. Pre-planning could help smooth-out this transition period. Workshop sessions especially designed for the new members could speed-up their progress, maintain their interest, and buoy their confidence. Emphasis should also be placed on their attending Saturday night dances programmed to their dancing level. During this period the needs of the regular or veteran member should not be ignored either. Special workshop sessions based on the "pink sheet" published by the basics committee plus other material your club caller can provide should be designed to maintain the club's dancing level. In this way, the legitimate interests of all club members can be serviced in a rational manner.

We do not consider the above ideas and suggestions to be definitive, but it is our hope they will provide focal points for fruitful discussions among our members which in turn will result in even better square dance classes. Happy dancing!
