1 Waltz fwd down LOD & diag away from ptrn (L,R,L);

2 Waltz fwd down LOD & diag twd ptrn (R,L,R) to brief BTFLY POS;

3 - 4

WALTZ BK-TO-BK 2,3 (HOLD ON); FACE-TO-FACE 2,3 (TO CLOSED POS);

3 Still progressing down LOD, retain joined lead hands (his L, Her R) & push those hands twd RLOD as ptrns turn bk-to-bk (L,R,L);

4 Still retaining same joined hands & progressing down LOD, turn in twd ptrn (M LF, W RF) R,L,R to assume closed dance position;

Last month we wrote about the beginning of our Dancer's Association and some of the reasons for its existence. Because we think the members are interested in the subject, we will continue by exploring the relationship of the dancers and his association.

By definition, an association is a voluntary alliance of many individuals having a common interest. In our case, it is square dancing. This means the association is no mysterious "they" - it is simply you and me. And since we can't all get together to conduct our affairs, we appoint or elect someone - a single or a couple - to represent us. We call that representative the club delegate.

The club delegate is the direct link between the club and the association; and how well he does his job can largely determine the success of each. It is the delegate's job to accurately represent the views of his club to all the other square dancer representatives and to keep his own club fully informed of association business.

This requires good representation and your club should demand no less. When you have good representation, keep them long enough to effectively represent you. Sending a new delegate every six months imposes a handicap on your club. Also, give your delegate the opportunity to keep the club membership informed on a regular basis. In fact, it would be well to insist that he does. Ask questions. Find out what is going on. After all, it is your association.

BEGINNING SQUARE DANCERS

Paul Allen

The season is just barely over when beginning square dancers have received their diplomas and now are setting out on their own to enjoy the fun in square dancing. However, too big a percentage of those diploma-bearing graduates may be having their fun - at the expense of others standing in a square waiting for an allemande-left to start dancing again.

I became somewhat curious about this a short time ago and did a little research on the reason why some beginners come through so well and deserve their diplomas while others barely make it up to about a ten-week level - yet they, too, have diplomas.

A diploma from a square dance instructor should mean that the person who has received it is capable of making a fairly creditable showing and has a working knowledge of the so-called 75 basics.

I have such a diploma and I am proud of it. It is framed and hangs in my living room. But, I had to earn it and my instructor would not have passed me or anyone if we didn't. And that's the way it should be with all instructors.

I suggest that the Callers' Association put such a topic on their agenda and draw up a set of rules whereby classes will be conducted accordingly. It's easy enough to pick-up the slow learners at the end of the first seven or eight lessons and warn them that unless they can meet a certain level say, by the 12th week, they will be asked to withdraw. The net result will be better classes and better attendance and happier beginners. We all know that one slow, or poor, dancer can kill a square. The same goes for an entire class.

As a class ends its weeks of instruction, the instructor should carefully evaluate his beginners and, if in his opinion, they all meet the dancing standards of his club or an average of all clubs, give them their diplomas. If some cannot meet those standards, then withhold their diplomas. It happens in school and I believe that people who sign up for square dance classes are old enough to understand, providing they have

been given a set of rules and regulations prior to entering the class.

In some classes there are those who cannot seem to grasp the action readily and make very little progress even as early as the fifth week. Then, it's up to the instructor to tell those persons about it and suggest that they drop out.

In our club we've had two persons with language barriers, both coming from countries where English was not spoken. Both had problems following the rapid calls necessary in square dancing. Both of these people were most gracious when I spoke to them about it and they agreed that leaving the class was the best thing they could do.

One last remark I'd like to make, and that is my hat is off to one square dance instructor I know of who refused to graduate an entire class recently because of their inaptitude.

Now, with new classes being planned, it might be a good idea for club officials to get together with their callers or whoever does their class instructing and formulate a set of rules governing the class. Some clubs make the successful completion of a class an automatic membership in the club while other clubs follow other methods. Whatever the net result is, however, should be made very clear to the beginners. Also, it should be made clear that unless the beginner can successfully perform as a square dancer with a good knowledge of all 75 basics, no diploma can be issued.

One other thing I've noticed. If the club members are desirous of having their beginners come through with flying colors, it is certainly a great help if the experienced dancer will go to the classes and dance with the beginners. Sure, it's simple stuff to you but remember, you were a beginner once yourself and you needed help. It's a good way to make new friends, too and also, to make our motto stand up - not just for the experienced - but make it "SQUARE DANCING IS FUN FOR EVERYONE," beginners included.
