And now back to the subject we've been discussing the past couple months - the Dancer's Association. Last month we talked about the Club Delegate who represents the dancers of his club. This month we will take a look at the next level in the Association - the District Director.

The District Director is a delegate elected by all the delegates in the district to represent the district dancers on the executive board. There are ten districts and ten directors. You may be interested in knowing the geographical boundaries of the various districts and the number of your own district. Your club delegate has a map of district boundaries and should be able to answer your questions concerning the district in which your club is located.

As a member of the executive board, the District Director plays a vital role in formulating the shape and direction of square dance programs and the day-to-day operations of the association. Not only does he represent the dancers of his district but he must maintain an awareness and sensitivity to the well being and best interests of all square dancers in the association.

To maintain contact with the dancers of his district, the director will visit each club at least once a year and will hold a minimum of two meetings with the delegate. This enables him to keep his fellow dancers informed of square dance activities at the association level and to keep himself informed with regard to square dance problems and the wishes of the dancers so that he can better represent them.

The delegate and the district director are

very important to square dancing in our area; and together with you, the dancer, they form a partnership to promote and ensure the success of square dancing in Northern California. It requires cooperation and intelligent action to make such a partnership work. Fortunately for us as square dancers, it has worked for a long time; and it is our earnest wish that it will continue to meet our needs for many, many years to come.
