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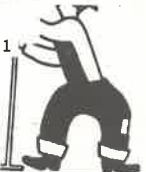

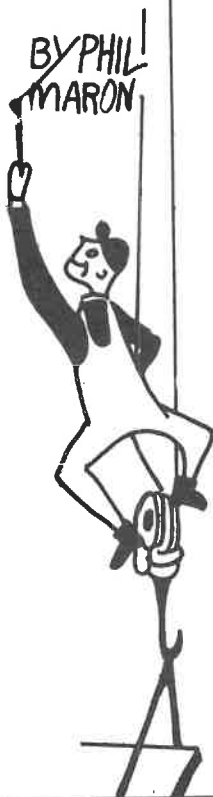

At the January general committee meeting, we appointed a nominating committee of one delegate couple from each of the dancer association's ten districts. They are listed in the order of their respective district number as follows; Gene and Lois George, Forty Niners; Earland Geary Burchell, Twilite Twirlers; John and Jean Spehar; Grass-hoppers; Don and Tommy Warnock, Five Star Squares; John and Eva McPherson, Mustangs; Dick and Dee Marquez, Skirts and Flirts; Jim and Thelma Wright, Valley Travelers; Ernest and Alva Fingerlos, Novato Squares; Floyd and Mary Foster, Clearlake Squares; Dwight and Maxine Miller, Island Squares. John and Jean Spehar were appointed temporary chairmen of the committee.

The committee was appointed early to provide plenty of time to select the best available candidate for the top four positions in our association - the president, the vice-president, the treasurer, and the secretary. The other board officers, the directors, are elected at the district level prior to the annual meeting in May.

The committee can only select a delegate or an alternate delegate for each of these offices; and each nominee must be contacted by the committee to confirm his willingness to accept the office if elected. A list of the nominees selected by the committee must be given to the secretary in time to be mailed to the club delegates at least four weeks prior to the May meeting.

At the May meeting, the delegates can make additional nominations from the floor for each of the four offices. Again, each nominee must be a delegate or an alternate delegate. When nominations are concluded, the election is held. Each club represented has one vote, and that vote can only be cast by the club delegate of record at the May meeting or, in the absence of the

delegate, by the alternate delegate of record at the May meeting. For each office, the candidate receiving a majority of the votes will be the respective officer for the ensuing year.

It is our hope we have made the association election procedures a little clearer for our members. If you have any questions regarding election procedures for dancer association offices discussed in this article, talk with your club delegate or one of the club members of the executive board.
