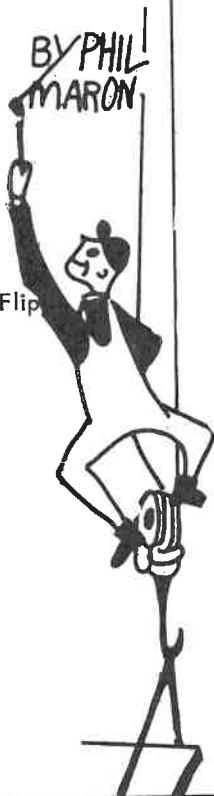

This month we are going to write about the association's Basic Program. As square dancers, we want to be able to dance the basic calls at the Saturday night hoedowns and the festivals we attend. Since modern dancing is such a dynamic, fascinatingly changing form of recreation, one of the major problems is standardizing the dancing basics and making them available to every square dancer.

Some years ago, in an effort to help solve this problem, the dancer's association and the caller's association began a cooperative project called the Basics Program. Each month an old basic and a current basic is selected by the Basics Chairman of the Dancer's Association, Vern and Minnie Branco, and the basics Chairman of the Caller's Association, Lee and Bev Buckingham.

A definition of the two basics for the month, plus material to help your club caller teach them, are mailed to the club delegate each month. These Basics Sheets are popularly known as the Pink Sheets because they are printed on pink paper. These two basics are workshopped by at least two clubs. They are workshopped again at the caller's meeting. All "bugs" have been removed from the printed material. HAVE FAITH IN THE PINK SHEET; if they are read correctly, the material will work.

Your club delegate presents these Pink Sheets to the club members so they are aware of the information in them. The delegate then gives the Basics to your club caller with the request that he feature the material during Work Shop. If your club caller is a member of the Caller's Association, he will have received his own copy, in his Caller's Notes. In this case, the delegate will post the Basics on the club bulletin board.

The Basics are not designed to restrict

either the caller or the dancer to the two basics each month. Any additional basics may be taught which are desired by the club and/or the club caller. However, if the material is used, there are two basics each month, or twenty-four in the course of a year, which are taught to every dancer in our association. This will help make square dancing more enjoyable for all of us. So ask your caller to use the material from the Pink Sheets each month.

We believe the dancer really appreciates the great job being done by the Basics Program Committee, and you can help the committee continue the good work by giving them the benefit of your suggestions. We are sure they would be happy to discuss any ideas you have with regard to the program.

er. He was even learning some of the singing calls to do at the practice sessions. Calling became more and more exciting and he became more and more interested in it. In May of 1962 he called his first dance.

Ken now calls for club dances, festivals, conventions, camps and weekend institutes throughout the country. His home program consists of five regular clubs. Des Moines, Iowa is where Ken and his wife, Dee and their 3 children reside. They are all square dancers and enjoy traveling as much as possible. His latest recording is "The Best Is Yet To Come."

Ken's unique voice has really spark-plugged the square dancers from the east to the west coasts. At the 1969 Golden State Round-Up he was so enthusiastically accepted by all the dancers that it was a must to invite him back again.

More feature caller information - Bud Redmond... Bud and "Mike" Redmond have been square dancing since 1960. Bud has been calling for ten years now. He has an active home program calling for four weekly clubs - two workshop groups and two classes in the Buffalo-Niagara Falls area of New York State. Weekends find him on the "road" filling calling engagements in the Eastern United States and Canada. He has called at most of the festivals and conventions in the East such as Akron, Syracuse, Cleveland and the Toronto International. Bud is also on the staff of Vacation Institutes in New Hampshire, Ontario, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Maryland and New York. Both Bud and wife "Mike" are really looking forward to the Golden State Round Up and a return to California where they met twenty-five years ago.
