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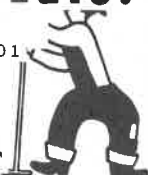

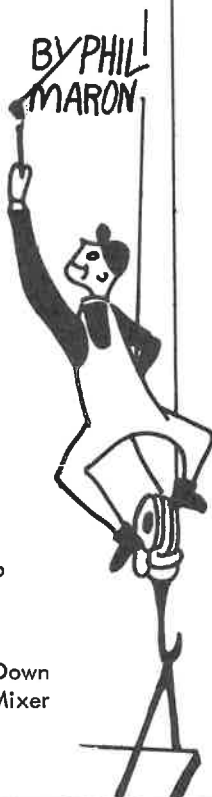

The second week of June each year finds Gary at the Kirkwood Lodge at the Lake of the Ozarks, Missouri. From 1968 to 1971 he was a full-time staff caller at Fun Valley Resort in Colorado. Home is Tulsa, Oklahoma for Gary, his wife and children and he is club caller for Gary's Goofers there in Tulsa.

The Oakland Masonic Temple will be available once again to the round dancers. Round dance coordinators, Manning and

Nita Smith, through their extensive touring and work with teachers at festivals and institutes all over the country are eminently qualified to present the very best in rounds and teaching techniques.

They have demonstrated their ability to thousands through their exhibitions at square and round dance festivals across the USA and Canada. They were sent to Europe for the U.S. Air Force, giving instructions to recreation leaders from service clubs at American bases in England, Germany, France and Turkey.

The Smiths have proven their ability as choreographers by writing dances in all rhythms, and the following dances are all still danced and are listed as classics: Mannita Waltz, Mannita Tango, Manning's Mixer, White Silver Sands and Mack's Rounds.

Both Nita and Manning are college graduates: Nita from the University of Texas in Physical Education and Recreation, Manning from Centenary College with a degree in physics and math, and at Texas A & M University he studied physical chemistry for his masters during the time he was coaching football, basketball, tennis, etc.

The Smiths conduct their own institutes in round dance teaching techniques from Coast to coast.

CALLER RUN CLUBS by John Murray

It is usually overlooked, but the most important thing that anyone can do for Square Dancing is to square dance, that's too

simple to be believable.

Let's talk about dancers who, having served their membership run club in all capacities, seek a square dance group whose dancing abilities and Caller meet their desires. They may find the same situation in most clubs where the taking in of newer dancers and turnover of members occur. When they cannot find a group that meets their needs they turn to the Caller run workshops.

The majority of those attending those workshops are active members of Association clubs. Caller run clubs are not eligible for membership in those associations and it is not those clubs that have refused association affiliation.

Let's face it, square dancing is a hobby in which these people are free to choose any type of organization they wish. No club or organization has a right to tell these people where to dance.

Most members dancing in this type of workshop find quite a relief in not being asked to participate in the administration of any club duties. To ask these dancers to change the structure of the club so they may belong to an association is unreasonable.

There are some things that should not be overlooked. Any workshop or club owes a debt to the club caller who has brought his dancers to the point where they have the ability to handle figures in these Caller run workshops and clubs. Most workshop callers know they would have no dancers were it not for the club caller and membership clubs.

No club or caller can be all things. We are all different. All square dancers have a common interest in square dancing. Let's both work to that end.
