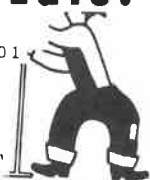

Highlights of the May 12 meeting in Sacramento.

Public Relations Seminar... The Council's Public Relations Seminar was held on March 24 in Santa Barbara. The speakers presented material regarding dealing with the various forms of news media, both internal and external to the square dance movement. All those attending expressed opinions which were of considerable importance. Seminar notes have been prepared covering the various aspects discussed at the sessions. Future seminars will be scheduled in the different Council Areas desiring to have them, among these will be one in Los Angeles vicinity during the Fall.

25th National Square Dance Convention - Anaheim - 1976. The test dance held on April 15 provided invaluable information regarding the danceability of the facilities at the Anaheim Convention Center. Selection of the National Committee Chairmen is nearly complete. Letter to the Editor

Dear Ed (itor)

Just read a good suggestion from David Dean of Willow Creek, Ca.

To avoid the usual hassle at the Beginner Class over whether so-and-so's should get a graduation diploma, because they missed a third of the lessons, make it mandatory that each learner SIGN IN for the minimum number of lessons, and only after the missing lessons were made up, would that couple graduate.

It's a great idea. It would not eliminate the couple with the dead ears and the two left feet, but it would be a way of impressing on Beginners that close attention and faithful attendance are essential, if one wants to learn to be a good dancer!

Might I add a suggestion that would make it possible for the whole class to graduate together? This is it:

Allow make-up classes by private tutoring, each session of private instruction to be of the same length as a class, and that the tutor be empowered by the club to accept the signature of the student as proof of a make-up session. There must be willing members of every club who could have a square of Beginners in for an evening of drill. From my own experience, I know it isn't the equivalent of a real class session, but the Beginners DO appreciate it, and they DO learn, even if they are not actually "square dancing" to a caller. Since so much of it is 'skull work' nowadays, the learning process can go on, just with repeated walk-throughs.

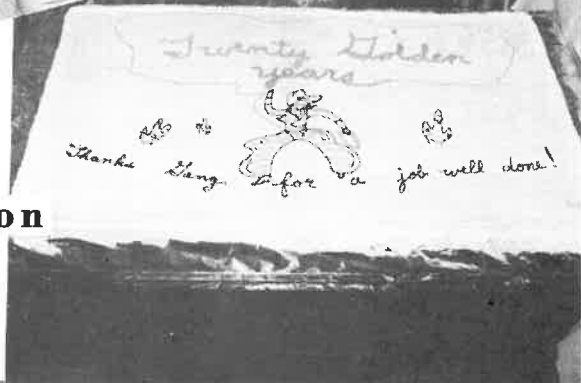

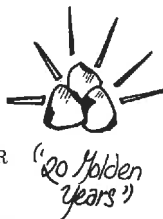

Old Wine in New Bottles *Allen Conroy*

New square dance figures are fun. We like to master the brain-child of some inventive caller, hoping to be able to do it again if it becomes popular at parties. It would be mighty dull if we never got beyond the "honor your partner, honor your corner, head couples forward and back, side couples forward and back, allemande left, grand right and left to home". It was a great day when Grand Square burst on the scene, and even more so when Square Thru and Star Thru were presented to a reluctant square dance world. Each one opened the door to many variations that have become an indispensable part of our great indoor sport.

But, doggone it, one sometimes gets a hankering for the sort of caller who can put together a tip of hot hash with nothing more complicated than the Basic Fifty figures. The late, great JIM YORK could do it, because of his exquisite sense of timing, and the drive he put into the exact command words. He could have the blasé Axle Draggers really jumping on a Saturday night at San Rafael's Carpenters' Hall. Happily, there are plenty of callers with similar skills who know that great calling and dancing can be composed from fairly simple material.

Recently, listening to S.I.O.'s 1972 records, I was struck by the fact that there's plenty of mileage left in the Fifty Basics that the American Square Dance Society has compiled for us. Eight fine callers produced one two-sided record with nothing more complicated - men like Earle Park from Saskatchewan, Marshall Flippo of Texas, and Bob Van Antwerp of California. Obviously, newness is not the only quality required of interesting material. What does make a good call?

First, we have the skill of the caller at choreography. One doesn't expect inventive figures to roll out of every workshop-caller's brain, but the caller does owe it to his dancers to study his art - not just his presentation, but moreso, the material. An industrious caller spends far more time thinking out his program than he does in actual practice out in the garage. Only a few pros, who call four or five times a week, can afford to skip "skull practice". There are plenty of aids, in the form of "Callers'

notes", etc., but it takes a second-sight to weed out the indifferent from the excellent material. If a club is lucky, their caller has the skills to write good original stuff, try it on a couple of goodsquares, and know instinctively whether it will "take" or should be thrown out pronto.

Next, the interesting caller will have that spark that tells him when to throw an old item into the routine, at a point where the dancers must do something a little unexpected, such as a 'Right-and-Left Thru from Arky Position,' or 'Man Face Your Partner, Grand Square,' to use a couple of older examples. At a high-level dance, there's more genuine satisfaction in doing a 'Slide Thru' when not facing anyone, than in mastering 'Relay the Deuce', which you might forget five minutes later.

Or, it may be the way that a caller has his dancers storing up a string of quick calls, that must be completed, but which cannot be danced at anything like the pace of the called words -- and which comes to a whoop of delight at the completion of the string, when everyone finds his corner right there for the unexpected "Left Allemande!" Jerry Helt can put dancers through a long bout of hot-hash, using innocent-sounding figures, in his low-key manner - he doesn't seem to be hurrying anyone - lots of voice pauses, yet we're going lickety-split to keep up. A Max Forsythe can take a crowd of indifferent dancers, and drill them in a new arrangement of an old idea, without it seeming a bit dull, because he is a superb "explainer", and takes his dancers into his confidence, instead of trying to "stump" them.

Of course, there's a place, particularly at big parties, for the enjoyable gimmick, like Harry Whitlock's "Star Prowl", which can be taught in three minutes, and leaves every dancer with the pleasurable feeling of having mastered something wonderful, even though it uses only the Star Thru, in an unusual way. But a gimmick, to qualify, must be basically simple, and thus recallable later in the evening, to those who had never done it before that night. "Rainbow Twirl" would qualify, but "beer Mug Chain" would not. Oddly, the fairly complex "Grand Spin" meets the criteria, perhaps because that great Colonel Bogey music drives people through! But it is seemingly much easier to digest than the apparently simpler "Relay" figures.

Whereas official recognition of the square dance will enhance the cultural stature of the United States, both nationally and internationally; and

Whereas national and international prestige is in the best interest of all Americans;
NOW, therefore, be it

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the dance known as the square dance is designated the national folk dance of the United States of America.

OBJECTIVE: A national American Folk Dance by the 93d Congress! The HOUSE and the SENATE!
