WHY PRIZES? by PAUL ALLEN

A question increasingly being asked by square dancers is "Why prizes?"

Let's take a look at the situation and see why. First, people go to hoedowns, not for prizes, but to dance. Proof of this is another question being asked while the prize awards are going on: "I wish they'd get this over with, I want to dance."

Many of you have won "prizes" at various hoedowns and so have I. I won a pot holder. Now what kind of prize is that at a square dance. What use does the average man have for a pot holder? Also, every woman already has more of the things than she can use. Pot holders are not the only insignificant things pawned off as prizes. Proof of this is from one club member who said "I just stick 'em away somewhere and give 'em to someone else when I can."

At today's hoedowns there's plenty of

activity without time-consuming prize awarding. There are generally club introductions, welcoming speeches, refreshments and round dancing.

Here's my suggestion to the prize situation. Instead of a lot of gadgets and stuff of little value, why not concentrate on one really good door prize (if prizes must be given). Or, two really good prizes, one for women, one for the men.

Square dancers are adult enough so that they don't have to have little "goodies" like prizes at every hoedown they attend. I have yet to meet one person who goes to a hoedown for prizes or that is attracted to any particular hoedown because of the prizes given. After all, it's the caller that attracts the dancers.
