President's Message

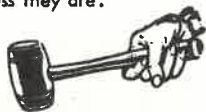
Jerry & Dorothy Kent

It was a real pleasure meeting you during the square dance convention held in Salt Lake City, June 28, 29, and 30, 1973. As you know, I was a guest at your press breakfast which kicked off the festivities. During the session, I heard several claims made by various committee officials that there would be no trouble for the police department, but quite honestly, I was concerned.

Naturally, we were happy for the opportunity to host a major convention. It meant extra dollars and, if all went well, an enhancement of our reputation for hospitality. However, extra thousands of people were being added to our population - including our downtown, night-time population. People away from home have a tendency to "live it up" and very often they infringe on the rights and privileges of others.

It is my pleasure to report that no such thing occurred during the three days that fifteen thousand members of your association danced their way into the hearts of local residents. To the best of my knowledge, no arrests were made and no serious reprimands were necessary by our officers. It's unfortunate that Chief J. Earl Jones was out of the city, but he has asked me to convey his gratitude to all the square dancers who were here for the fine citizenship they exhibited.
