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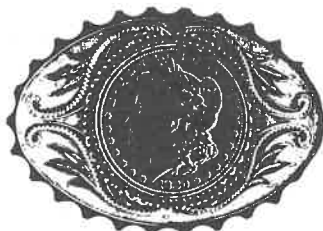

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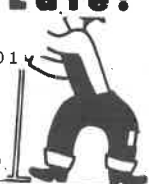

Expanded School Use Cuts Vandalism

Expanded community use of schools cut vandalism which runs to \$800,000 a year in Santa Clara County and \$100 million annually nationwide.

This was the mid-year report of the education committee of the County Grand Jury Wednesday.

"Possibly the strongest recommendation this committee could make is its encouragement of parent involvement in school activities," the committee said.

The report, issued by Acting Presiding Superior Court Judge John S. McNerny, lauded the Alum Rock and Sunnyvale schools which "seem to lead the way."

"It was also found vandalism is more prevalent after school hours, during the week-ends and during the summer vacation. When people are in school or when organizations and groups are using the school facility, vandalism is very limited," the report added.

"The committee therefore recommended expanded school activities.

It urged groups be encouraged to use the schools and that custodians remain on duty until 11 p.m. The committee said it is "not necessary" to charge groups with custodial costs in such cases, as is now often done.

"They have attempted to make their schools' educational and recreational facilities for all of the people. In a sense they

have returned the schools to the people. Other school districts should look to this experience," the committee said.

Chaired by Edward H. Comunez, labor leader, the committee said it "strongly feels the community attitudes must be changed if vandalism is to be reduced.

"The community school administrators, teachers, parents and especially students must realize that schools and school facilities are their property," committeemen said.

The committee said school vandalism in the county was running between \$500,000 and \$800,000 a year and the Insurance Company of North America, a major school carrier in the Valley, puts vandalism costs over the past two years past \$1 million.

"The highest cost item, other than arson, appears to be window breakage," the committee noted.

"It also cited bicycle thefts, defacement of walls, destruction of athletic fields by minibikes, motorcycles and automobiles.

"Committeemen concurred with the county juvenile probation department that there "is a lack of uniform accounting of vandalism" making it difficult to reach real cost figures.

"We found that where there is expanded use of school facilities by the community, instances of vandalism dropped," the report stated.
