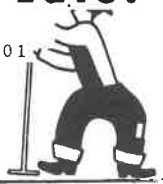

President's Message

Jerry & Dorothy Kent

In answer to the many people who have asked why we chose to move the Golden State Round-Up from Oakland to San Francisco we hope the following will help to provide some of the answers.

As you have heard for years, the Oakland Auditorium will be torn down some time in the next few years. We've never been given a definite date which makes planning for the future a little difficult. At that time we would probably be able to move into the new Oakland Auditorium but this facility will have less danceable floor space than we now enjoy and the seats will be permanently in place. So we would end up with less space when what we have to have to end our present crowding is more space. We have already reached capacity in Oakland. So there is no place for us to grow in the East Bay. Or to even handle the crowds we presently have for the Round-Up.

The move to San Francisco Civic Auditorium offers substantially larger quarters than anything we presently have and should give us the room we need so badly to handle our present crowds plus additional room for the future. There are other advantages as far as space goes. The Round Dance halls will be in the Civic Auditorium also (they have been across town in Oakland). We will also have a cafeteria type coffee shop where there will be space to sit down plus escalators to the upper floor balcony areas. The concession type square dance shops will be in a small separate hall in Civic Auditorium. There are large areas with street parking in the immediate area as well as a 900 car underground garage within one block. For those registered at the hotel there will be free parking.

The future for us as an Association in San Francisco would be a first hold on Round-Up weekend on Civic Auditorium and the first choice of this date when the Yerba Buena

Center is done. Yerba Buena has or will have 300,000 square feet or enough room to hold the Nationals and would take care of all of our needs in the future.

If this is not a permanent move this could mean the eventual loss of dancing space we need so badly. There could be a time when we will spend Round-Up Weekend driving from hall to hall looking for a place to park, and hearing each feature caller on a separate location as our Round Dancers have to do now. We are looking to the future in this move.

PROFILE OF OUR FEATURED CALLERS

NORM WILCOX - Brampton, Ontario

Norm and Nina Wilcox started dancing in Belleville, Ontario, in 1961. At that time there were no callers in their community so they learned to dance to records. Their early teachers included Lee Helsel, Arnie Kronenberger, Bob Van Antwerp and Bill Castner - all on LP records. Before the year was up, Norm's interest switched to calling and by 1965 he was calling for four clubs and teaching one beginner class.

Norm lives in Brampton, Ontario with his wife Nina and four children. A full time job keeps him at home during the week but on Saturday nights Norm and Nina can be found anywhere within a radius of 300 miles from home. Norm has served on the staff of several festivals including the Toronto International Convention and the Washington Spring Festival.

JON JONES - Arlington, Texas

Jon Jones was first introduced to square dancing 20 years ago at a Texas County Centennial where he was taught by an old time caller and took part in an exhibition dance that mainly consisted of "Chase the Rabbit, Chase the Squirrel". After moving to Arlington, Texas, he had a series of lessons with the City Recreation Department and soon became interested in the calling phase that eventually led to teaching square dancing. Today he calls regularly for two clubs and teaches beginner classes in con-

junction with the City of Arlington Recreation Department. Jon has called at numerous festivals and weeklong institutes in many states and in Canada. He records under Kalax label.

Jon and his wife, Shirley, live in Arlington with two sons and one daughter where Jon is employed as a building official for the city.

BARRY MEDFORD - Houston, Texas

Barry Medford was recently featured as "Caller of the Month" in the Sets in Order magazine of the American Square Dance Society. Single, and in his very early twenties, he appears to be well on his way to a successful career in the field of calling.
