1-4 In Open-Facing pos (M's bk to COH) wait 2 meas then do a standard Intro ending in Semi-Closed pos both facing LOD;

Round dancing at the Round-Up... if you were at the NCSDA anniversary dance the first Sunday in January you had an opportunity to see the large hall, just across the corridor from the main arena, that will be used exclusively for round dancing.
