Two very special non-dancing events are scheduled for the dancers at the Round-Up this year. A MICROPHONE TECHNIQUE panel will take place on Saturday afternoon moderated by Ed Ferrario and assisted by our featured callers. We want to stress that this is not a panel that is programmed for callers. This is for club leaders, men and women, present and future officers who at some time will have occasion to use a microphone. One of the first steps in conquering "mike fright" is to be familiar with the equipment. Ed will have an assorted variety of microphones covering just about any that you might have to use and he will show you how to turn it on and how to tell if it is working, (how many flustered speakers have you seen blowing into or tapping away at the 'mike' . . . their confidence shattered before they speak their first word). You will be shown how to hold the microphone and the distance and position to consider when using it so that your words come out loud and clear. A lesson in self-confidence, condensed, just for you at the Microphone Technique Panel on Saturday afternoon.

On Sunday afternoon, a special feature planned just for the ladies, a SEWING CLINIC OF SQUARE DANCE FASHIONS, coordinated by Bobbie Shotwell and conducted by Ruth Johnson. Ruth and her husband Bob are proprietors of "Bob's Western Wear", a square dance specialty shop in Long Beach, so you can expect plenty of new ideas and fresh designs. We haven't had a 'show & sew' since the 14th annual Round-Up so this should be quite a treat for the ladies, especially those who have started dancing since that time. Some of the latest square dance fashions will be displayed, new ideas for trims, short-cut sewing tricks demonstrated and patterns that can be traced for your own use. SQUARE TALK

by Bill Hanzel



This first edition of SQUARE TALK deals with the teenage square dance movement and how we as adults can help.

One main problem area of teen square dancing is finding a suitable hall to dance in. For an adult club this is not much of a problem as most adult clubs are self-sufficient and can afford \$18 a night or have some other arrangement for dancing because we are adults. For most teen clubs it is nearly impossible to afford \$18 a night so using a city school is out. Some clubs have been able to find a neighborhood church that has been willing to let the teens use the church facilities for little or nothing. Others are lucky to be sponsored by the City Parks and Recreation Department, but not all city parks and recreation departments are willing to sponsor teen square dance clubs. For those who are not so lucky, they are usually forced to fold.

We as adults should NOT allow this to go on. The teenage square dance movement needs all the help it can get, and all the help we as adults can give. After all, these are the future square dancers who will someday become adults.

We all pay school taxes. We should expect our children to benefit by these taxes. Yet to get a school the same youngster must stand in line behind: (1) School functions; (2) PTA functions; (3) Boy and Girl Scouts; (4) Civic organizations and (5) City Recreation Departments (other than square dancing). All of which use school halls for free. Square dancing - whether adult or teens that are sponsored by the City Parks and Recreation Departments have last place in line for school facilities. Should any of the functions listed above need the school, square dancing gets bumped even though they have use of the facility every week. School functions and PTA functions are the only exception because they are dealing directly with the student and school. However, all others are extra-curricular activities, as is square dancing. Therefore all should have equal

opportunity, but do not.

Unfortunately because square dance clubs have a hired, paid employee, the caller, they fall into a category of last place. Why? - because of the paid employee. So in the case of teen clubs by paying for the use of school facilities which are used at night is DOUBLE TAXATION. Why DOUBLE TAXATION? Because in order to obtain a school which there is a fee, the teens are charged dues which in turn pay the caller and other expenses, in this case the hall. Most of the teens are paying dues from allowances which the parents give them. The parents are paying for school taxes so thus the DOUBLE TAXATION. The school district says you can use their facilities for free but you can't have any paid employees. Callers cannot afford to dedicate their time for free every week since he must buy gas, records, equipment, maintain equipment, car, clothes, etc. And the little the teen club can afford to pay the caller just about covers records and gas. I

don't know of any caller for a teen club that is getting rich, monetary that is!

Now how can we correct this inequity? We can work as a group or as individuals and write our State Board of Education and complain about the situation, we can write the school districts involved and fight for our sons and daughters and if all else fails we can write our State Assemblymen and Senators, and hope something can be done. But we must find some way for the young people to continue to enjoy the wholesome and recreational activity we all enjoy. We must not let teenage square dancing die. These are our future square dancers, they will keep square dancing going after we are too old to stomp our feet. The youngsters of America are the future of America

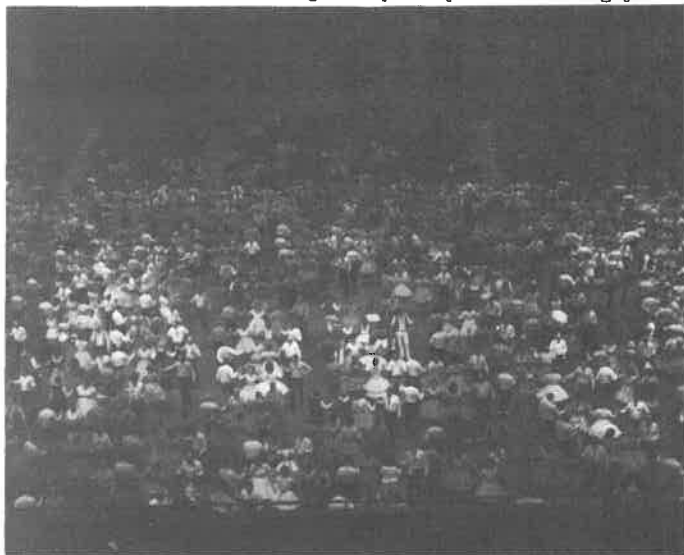

Square Dance Callers Ass'n. of Northern Calif. by Bill Hanzel

The monthly meeting of the NCSDCA was held Sunday, February 24, at Washington School, John Strong presiding.

The major discussion centered around a standardized set of basics to be used when planning advertising for hoedowns and as a guide for caller/instructors. A section of "mainstream" calls would be included and revised as necessary to keep up with the ever changing square dance movement. (Speaking of movements. Bob Friedman and yours truly are in the process of writing a new one called "Castor Oil".)

The basics for the month include "Cloverleaf" (old) and "Peel the Top" (new.)

Good news for some of us and everybody connected with teenage square dancing. The "Stardettes" are going to Poland. They have been invited to perform behind the Iron Curtain at a Polish festival by the Polish Government. The Stardettes are the first west coast teen group to be so honored. Ed "Ferrarioski" and Joel "Kadishski" are so thrilled they are already applying for passports. Now all they need to do is find \$34,000 somewhere for plane tickets, etc. Maybe some of you know how we can help the Stardettes raise the money. John Strong said he'd help Ed "one way". Now how does he get back??

I presume all of you have noticed the price increase in SQUARE-DANCE WHERE? I know some people were a little irritated about the \$2 increase in subscription price, but it is still a bargain. If you bought an issue at a time, it would cost 50¢ each or \$6 per year, therefore, a subscription saves you \$2. It costs 45¢ to publish each issue and that comes to \$5.40 per year or \$1.40 savings over the publishing cost. Now the reasoning behind a price increase is (1) the cost of paper has gone up; (2) cost of printing is up; (3) mailing costs are up; and with all this price increase the employees haven't had a pay raise. So to keep this fine magazine coming, the subscription cost must go up.

Some of you might wonder why not increase advertising rates. Well as it is now, advertising keeps the magazine going. Advertising contributes more money to the magazine than subscriptions and if advertising rates were raised, we could expect a drop in advertising.

In comparing Square Dance-Where? with other publications, we stack up very favorably.
