It won't be easy, and it won't be cheap.We are living with atom bombs, pollution, smog, instant over-kill. If you are in the category of an oldster, be proud of it. Wear your age like a badge. Clogging Comes to California!

Clogging? What is it? It is the fastest growing new branch on the family tree of square dance recreation.

Have you ever looked around a room full of square dancers just as the music started

and noticed all the toes tapping? Well, take that response one step further and you have got it. For that's what clogging is. It's enthusiasm set to music with the accent set squarely (how else) on the beat and tap shoes added for emphasis. And square dancers in increasing numbers are wanting to do both.

Clogging itself is nothing new: it's been having a foot-stomping good time in the Eastern Mountains for as long as the settlers have known how to "fiddle around", (a tune, that is). What is new is that clogging has come down out of the hills and been recognized with a great shout (and tap) by its citified cousins.

From down Atlanta, Georgia way, Violet Marsh, the instructor, has "brought a sharing of the fun to California." "Fun is what it's all about", says Violet, "and we're eager to share the fun with anyone who's interested in it. You don't need a partner and you need not know any type of dancing previously. If you can walk to music, you can clog."

Now a word about our instructor. Thanks to a transfer by Shell Chemical Company, "Georgia's Gorgeous Clogger" and one of the top instructors, Violet Marsh, has become one of the Bay Area square dancers, and the clogging instructor for Diablo Mountain Cloggers. She is also scheduled to teach the Stardettes clogging before they go to Poland for their marvelous tour of performances. After learning clogging, Violet learned to square dance in 1969 and has been a promoter of both ever since. In 1970 she organized a popular clogging group Kennesaw Mountain Kloggers near Atlanta, Georgia.

Among their many accomplishments they captured six trophies out of twenty-four given in a competition in Kentucky. Six out of seven cloggers entered with a group of 130 contestants were winners. Two weeks ago, the group (KMK) danced for a crowd of 8,000 in Atlanta. They have been chosen to coordinate the workshops and exhibitions for the Georgia State Square Dance Convention this year. They are booked solid for performances through the year and are on the staff of four square dance festivals as the clogging instructors. Can you see why she's proud as punch of them? Her intention is to have just as many Californians enjoying clogging, and they are off to an excellent start. Diablo Mountain Cloggers started

a 'non-advertised' beginners class in January. Having graduated from the basics in March, the group has five performances already scheduled including the California State Singles Convention in San Jose on May 18.

In May, we plan to start a 'well' advertised beginners class as can be seen in our ad in this issue.

So - o - o keep Monday evenings open and get that extra exercise as well as enjoy a new type dance. Come on out and join us. We'd like to see you down there - YOU ALL!!!
