Dear Mr. Coates:

We were disappointed to learn that the Northern California Square Dancers Association had decided this year, for the first time, to hold its Round Up in San Francisco. This has been traditionally an Oakland event, and we had hoped that it would remain so.

We were surprised, however, to find that the reason for your change was that the "Oakland Auditorium will be torn down some time in the next few years." The City has made no such decision. While the maintenance and improvement costs of the Auditorium have been questioned from time to time, no decision to demolish it has been made and we are not aware of any official moves in this direction at all.

I am referring your letter and a copy of this reply to Mr. Robert Beritzhof, Oakland Chamber of Commerce, and to Mr. Jay Ver Lee, Oakland Director of Parks and Recreation, for their information.
