We thought the best place to start was at the club level so this month we are going to talk about the CLUB DELEGATE, the person selected by you to represent your club at the General Committee Meeting of the NCSDA. When you make the selection of a Delegate be sure he is available to attend the Sunday meetings three or four times a year, that he is the type of person that will bring the information back to the club such as by-laws amendments, insurance coverage, ideas about how to raise money for your club, or how to keep members from taking newer dancers to hoedowns beyond their level or voting for the callers for the Anniversary Dance. Your Delegate is the person that votes for your club when it comes time to vote for the officers of NCSDA, it is up to your club to tell this person how they want him to vote, he is there to cast the one vote for your club and it should be the club's decision not his alone.

The only one authorized to sell you membership cards to the Stampedes or to the Anniversary Dance is your Club Delegate. These cards are for members of Association Member Clubs, do not ask your delegate to sell a card to a friend that is not a member of your club, you are asking him to betray the trust the club has placed in him if you do.

It has been proven that those clubs whose Delegate is a member of his club Executive Board is better informed about what is going on in the Square Dance World. A Delegate should feel proud to serve his club on this committee and to know that his club feels he is doing a good job. Being a Delegate is the first step to becoming a Board Officer of the NCSDA.

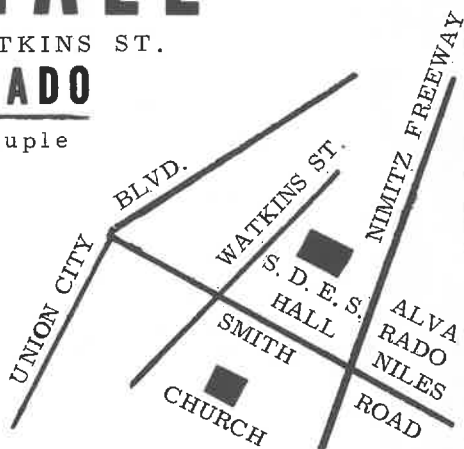

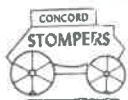
