The High Cost of Magazine Publication!

Yesterday an unexpected blow befell us when our printer informed us that paper prices in July had increased 50 per cent because of higher wages and shortages of pulp.

This will amount to about an increase in cost to Square Dance-Where? of about \$250 a month, a cost which we find impossible to absorb, since we are already just skimming by. We must therefore reluctantly raise the advertising rates effective with the October Issue as follows:

1/4 page	\$10.00
1/3 page	12.00
1/2 page	15.00
Full Page	25.00

A \$2.00 charge for stripins (photo or art work) and reverse positive.

This is a 25 per cent increase in advertising rates. We might add, if our new President Ford has any ideas on controlling inflation, we're going to need them very soon if we are to survive.

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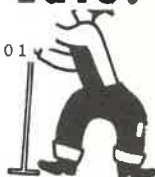
