This month the District Directors have been asked to submit the name of a delegate from his district to serve on the nominating committee. If you are asked to serve, try to accept, it isn't a hard job but it is very important to you and your club that you pick the right people to run for these offices. Pick a person that is interested in Square Dancing and all the dancers rather than one that wants to sit at the head table.

Remember these jobs are all voluntary and the only thing these people get paid for is their postage and telephone calls. This year the committee will have the guidelines set forth in the new bylaws to assist them in their job. We hope it is of some help to them. If you as a dancer know of someone that would make a good officer get the information to the person from your district that is on the committee. Don't just give him a name, give him a short resume on the person, remember when he submits a name at the meeting he must be prepared to tell about the person and what he can do or has done for Square Dancing. Remember that a person to run for one of the elected offices must have been a delegate for at least one year. After the nominations have been made the job is still to be done so be sure your club is represented the day of the elections, May 16, 1975.

They're God's greatest gift to our lives!

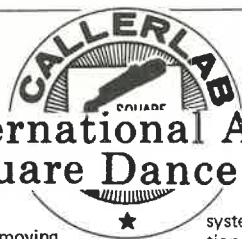

The International Association of Square Dance Callers

Sandusky, Ohio — Plans are moving swiftly ahead for the largest gathering of square dance callers in history. On March 24, about seven hundred callers and wives from every state and Canadian province will convene at the Marriott Motor Hotel in Chicago for the second annual Callerlab Convention.

Stan Burdick, executive secretary of Callerlab, also known as the International Association of Square Dance Callers, announced that over five hundred persons have registered to date, and he predicts a "sell-out" affair.

Dave Taylor, convention chairman, points out that this is an "invitational" conclave. Most of the "greats" of the calling profession will be there, as well as an equal number of strictly area and local callers.

For three days, March 24 to 26, these professional entertainers will be involved in discussions and hear speakers to help improve their skills and trying to resolve some of the key issues of the square dance activity. Matters of styling, standardization, list of basic movements, an identification

system, training of callers, accreditation, and promotion will be on the agenda. No actual dancing will take place.

Resolutions are expected to result from this event that will undoubtedly have an effect on the activity for some two and a half million square dancers coast to coast and internationally.

Previous to the convention opening at two o'clock on Monday, twenty-three members of the Board of Governors will meet on Sunday to discuss organizational matters. The convention theme is "Time For Action." A special highlight of the event will be the Tuesday night banquet, at which time three special "Milestone Awards" will be presented to callers who have made an outstanding contribution to the activity.

In addition to Taylor and Burdick, other members of the convention committee are Frank Lane of Colorado and Marshall Flippo of Texas. Canadian liaison is Angus McMorran of Ottawa. Further information may be obtained from the Callerlab office at P.O. Box 788, Sandusky, Ohio 44870.
