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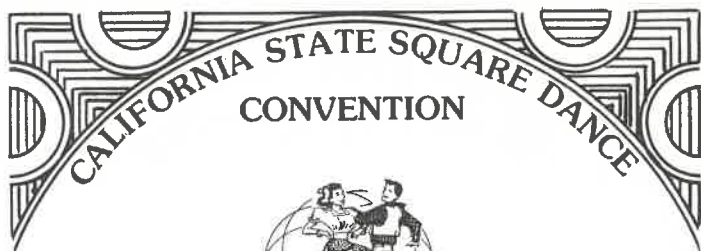

Square Dancers Ass'n No. Calif. *'President's Message'* Bob & Betty Coates

Does your district have a District Calendar? People are always asking how calendars work and whether or not it is a good idea to have one? They will work if the people want them to work and if they stick to the listings. Calendars are strictly voluntary, no one can force a group to abide by them or even to have one but we do know they have helped in a lot of areas. One rule must be made: (If you are going to be placed on the calendar you must abide by it) The Association has nothing to do with the calendars and how they are set up, it has to be done on your own at a district level.

It isn't enough to list the dances your club wants to hold, you have to be willing to change or even give up a few dates to make it work. The fact that a club has been holding a dance every month the same Saturday for ten years is not as important as whether or not they are willing to give up a few dates to let one of the newer groups have an open date for a dance. One way to open up a few nights is to hold the Beginner or Newer Dancer, dances on Friday night instead of Saturday. Most of the areas that have had the best luck have started with listing their Anniversary Dances and once they were working good started on the rest of the year. It isn't necessary to list the callers for the dances that only creates competition. Think a minute and decide, is your anniversary date the date your club was first formed?, the date of the first hoe-down? or the date the first class graduated? Any of these dates can qualify for an Anniversary Date so be flexible. If every club in your district has a different Anniversary Date then you can attend each others dances and everyone will have a successful dance. A little teamwork can go a long way.

STATE COUNCIL NOTES

In the current minutes of the last State Council Meeting held at the Holiday Inn in San Bernardino on Nov. 9, 1974 was this very interesting item of what should be of great interest to all our clubs as follows:

Bank Accounts - Norm Holloway...A new ruling from IRS through all the Federally Chartered Banks, and I assume also the state banks. Anyone opening a new bank account now, either must give a Social Security number or a Federal Tax Number. Now think about that - what it could do to all our clubs and all of our associations all over the whole country. Take this back to your respective associations. Don't panic people with it, but eventually, if your club or if your association has a bank account that does not have a number, the bankers are eventually going to be asking for a number. It is either going to be a personal social security number or a federal employee or tax number. The IRS is requiring non-profit organizations to conform to IRS rules. Suggestion to your clubs: If they have existing bank accounts and have had for a number of years in the bank, if they have a new treasurer elected, recommend that the bank account stay right where it is and the new treasurer doesn't move it; just change your signature cards. Most bankers are going to try to stall off the federal investigators forcing this issue with small accounts as most clubs have. By law that number must be there one way or the other. Certainly I know each one of you would not want to have your social security number on a bank account for a club or an association. Warn your clubs and be warned yourself. This is now a law, and we can't escape it. Be very careful. This law went into effect 60 to 90 days ago.

Also, the "Beginner Handbooks" discussed at the August meeting of Council is now a reality. D.C.P. has published a booklet entitled "Square Dance Fundamentals An Introduction To Square Dancing" and a copy of this booklet should have been distributed to each member of Council for this meeting. It is understood that the price of the booklets is 9¢ per copy and it is hoped that each Association will see fit to make the booklet available to each club for distribution to beginners.

Our featured callers have interesting backgrounds that you should know about. Ken Anderson... In 1956 Ken was invited to join a square dance club in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. From that night on he knew square dancing was for him. He took some lessons and then tried calling. By 1965 he was so thoroughly involved in square dancing that he decided to try calling professionally.

During Ken's last six months in Iowa the tragic explosion at Keokuk occurred, where 21 of his close square dance friends were killed. He also decided to give up calling but working with the Keokuk disaster committee, he found that he could not stop participating in an activity where the people were so thoughtful when things were so bad.

Ken moved to New York in early 1966. He has workshops called K.A. Squares besides calling for three clubs and teaching a newer dancers class. Ken records on several labels and since 1969 he and John Hendron started a label of their own JAY BAR KAY Records. Ken's wife, Doris, and their two children are part of the team.

John Hendron... Has been calling for eighteen years and danced for five years before that. Happily married for 29 years to "Bea" and they have two sons - Gary and Greg.

John is currently calling for 13 different clubs in a three-state area. The club levels vary from the beginner to high advanced or closed. He enjoys calling for any level as long as the dancers are having fun.

John is on the staff of Funstitute, Jug End, Kirkwood Lodge, Hidden Valley, Ponconno Manor, Grossingers, Mardi Gras, Red Carpet and several others, for week-ends. He has worked the Washington Festival, Toronto Festival (3 times), Syracuse Festival, Florida Round Up and several others.

He has recorded for LORE, LONGHORN, FLIP, JAY BAR KAY, and RED BOOT labels. Together with Ken Anderson, John was one of the original owners of the JAY BAR KAY Record Company. His most recent release is "Broadminded Man" on a RED BOOT label.

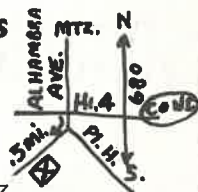

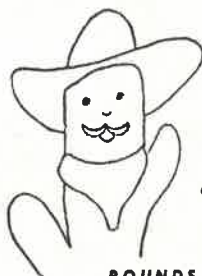

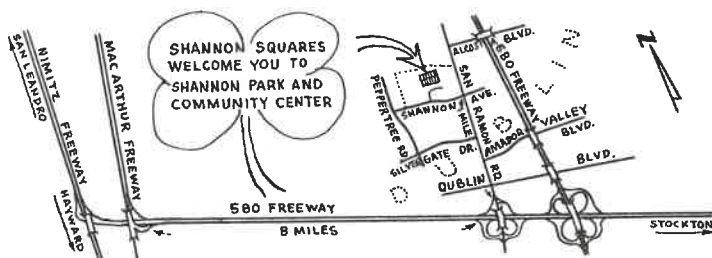
