The Secretary's job is the busiest of all the offices in the NCSDA. Changes come in the mail every day and as soon as they are printed they are out of date. Many times people give us verbal changes at a dance or meeting, this is the wrong way to do things if we are going to have names spelled correctly and phone numbers and addresses correct. All District Directors have available for you a printed yellow form for submitting changes, to the rosters. This can be a caller change, delegate change, address or any other type change you feel we should know of. If the delegate to your club is not receiving the stampede cards or the meeting notices then check and see if a change was sent in the last time you changed delegates. The Secretary makes changes every month just before he goes to the meeting which is the third Sunday of every month so get the changes in the mail before the second week of the month to keep things up to date. It would solve a lot of problems if a club would keep a delegate in office for a longer period of time.

One of the reasons most districts are not represented among the elected officers is because the delegates change so often, remember, a delegate has to have been a delegate for over a year before he can run for one of the elected offices.

Another thing to remember is when you select a District Director, select someone that is really interested and he must belong to a member club in your district to represent you.
