As the year comes to a close we find ourselves wondering if we did as much as we should have this past year. If we left something undone you can be sure the people you have elected will pick up the pieces and carry on. First and foremost the NCSDA is not supposed to dictate club policy, your club is your own and you can do as you see fit as long as you do not disregard the bylaws. You do not have to go to the one in your area if you don't want to. Try one of the other areas once in a while and see what is going on, on the other side of the fence. Remember, always wear square dance clothes when you go to a dance, especially the ladies, a skirt that flows with you and billows out when you twirl is much prettier than slacks or jeans.
