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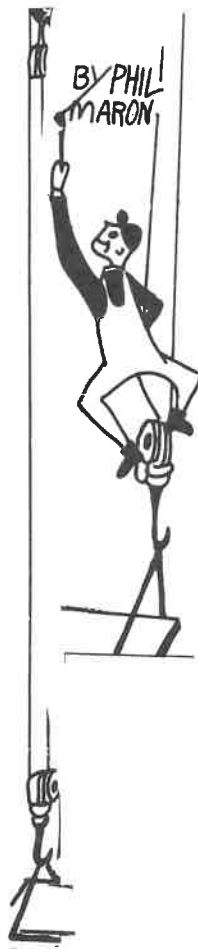

Letter to the Editor

Dear Editor,

I'm writing to you to express my concern over the recent deaths due to heart attacks at hoedowns.

I feel some of the contributing factors are:

The tips are too long. A record is a normal 3½ minutes, but some callers play the record 2 to 3 times, then put on a singing call which runs the tip to twenty minutes of continuous dancing.

Social pressure is placed on people to fill all squares. The callers will try to fill every square on the floor before they start to dance, even if it means playing their hash record through twice before they start. This penalizes the tired person all the more.

If etiquette demands that people leave the hall to find rest, I think etiquette should be changed. There is no standard rest period between tips, and there is no standard "President's time for announcements."

Extremely crowded floors help to tire out a dancer faster, when you have to guard your movements and defend your position, the tension builds to an undesirable level. I think the floor could be rated and not allowed to exceed that limit just to feed a sponsoring group's treasury or a caller's ego.

Years ago, I was in a situation that the only measure of endurance is when men passed out, I think the time has come to change this philosophy before square dancing kills us all.
