We know that from time to time NCSDA Member Clubs have problems arise that seem to be unsolvable. When a situation like this occurs it could cause unrest or unhappiness between club members, which could lead to them leaving the club or even go so far as disbanding the club. This situation need not necessarily happen as assistance and/or guidance can be obtained through your Association by various standing committees. Two of these committees are the "Club Services" and "School Costs" Committees. Although this subject has been covered in the past we thought it would be helpful to refresh the memories of our older members and explain to our newer members, their functions.

The Club Services Committee will, upon request, assist or guide a club in such matters as how to start a beginners class, procedures in obtaining a hall or school for hoedowns and workshops and most important act as arbitrator to clear up internal club problems.

The School Costs Committee was established to help clubs obtain a more economical fee structure in the rental of schools for Workshop by working with the School Board Officials. In many cases they have been successful in getting these fees reduced or eliminated.

A club need only submit a letter to the Association Executive Board requesting assistance and they will be contacted. 'Till next time, happy squares.
