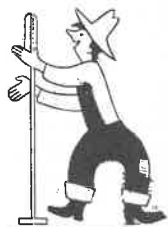

Some years ago, in an effort to solve the problem of standardizing the dancing basics and making them available to every square dancer, the Dancers' Association and the Callers' Association began a cooperative project called the Basics Program. Every two months a current basic and an old basic is chosen by the Basics Chairman of the Dancers' Association, JOHN & ELFREDA PARSONS, and the Basics Chairman of the Callers' Association, RUTH & JACK PETRI.

A definition of the two basics, plus material to help your club caller teach them, are mailed to the club delegate. Your club delegate gives this material, popularly known as the Pink Sheet, to the club members so they are aware of the information in them. The delegate then gives them to your club caller with the request that he features the material during workshop.

The Basics Program was not designed to restrict either the Caller or the Dancer to the two basics printed. Any additional basics may be taught which are desired by the dancers and/or the club caller.

However, if the Pink Sheets are used, every dancer in the Association will be taught these basics. This will help make square dancing more enjoyable for all of us. Until next month, happy dancing!
