As you know there are many jobs performed throughout our Square Dance World. Although they are all important to further our dancing pleasure some are more arduous and time consuming than others. Such is that of the District Directors.

Who are they?

What do they do?

Well they are dancers just like you and me who are elected by the Delegates of their district to represent the district dancers on the Executive Board of our Northern California S/D Association. In this capacity they play an important roll in formulating the shape and direction of square dance programs and the day to day operations of our Association. In order to maintain contact with the dancers of their district, they will visit each club at least once a year and will hold two 4-D (District Director/District Delegate) meetings each year with the delegates of all clubs within their district. Although these meetings are a minimum requirement, the Directors find it advantageous for more frequent meetings. These meetings are scheduled by the Director with a two-week notice which includes the planned agenda. This allows the Delegate sufficient time to meet with their clubs and discuss what they feel should be brought to the attention of the Director as well as those items on the agenda which may pertain to their club.

Examples of agenda items might be; keeping member club changes current, club problems, information on Association affairs pertinent to the clubs.

These are just a few of the directors duties and responsibilities but in the limited space available we are unable to list them all. As the elected representative of a district (there are 10 in our association) the Director must keep himself informed with regard to square dancing problems and the wishes of the dancers so that he can better represent them. The Delegate and District

Director are very important to square dancing in our area, and with you the dancer, a partnership like this, will assure the success of square dancing in Northern California. 'Till next time, Happy Squares.
