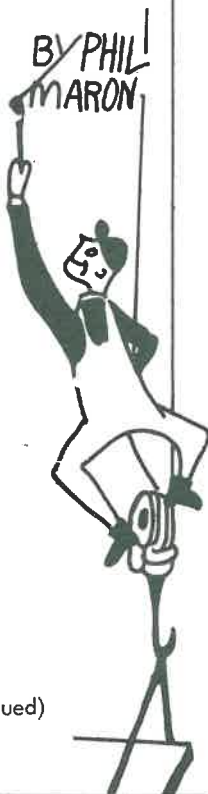

Square Dancers Ass'n No. Calif. 'President's Message' John & Mary Lou Richter

As we enter this year of our Bi-Centennial it seems most fitting to discuss one of our primary inalienable rights. That of the ballot and how it relates to the election of your NCSDA officers.

At the February 15, 1976 General Meeting each District Director shall submit the name of one Delegate or Alternate Delegate from their district, who is not on the NCSDA Executive Board, to serve on the nominating committee. This committee is charged to select one candidate for each of the elective offices, which consist of President, Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary. Membership on this committee carries with it the heaviest responsibility the NCSDA can lay upon its members, for their decisions can have such far reaching effects on the Association and in turn, you the dancers. The selection of these candidates is no easy job as each committee member must have a thorough knowledge of each officer's job as well as a broad acquaintance with square dancers to know where the talent lies. Upon selection each candidate should submit in writing a resume of his qualifications to hold office, two of which must be having served at least one (1) year as a delegate or alternate delegate and shall be at least 21 years of age. It should be noted that final committee selection is not restricted to only those candidates having submitted their resumes. After the committee has made its selections by written ballot their report is then submitted to the President for election by BALLOT of the General Committee at the Annual Meeting in May. However, before the final ballot is taken at this meeting, nominations will be taken for any of these offices from the floor. Upon completion of the election the nominating committee is automatically discharged from further duties.

You may wonder why the committee selects only one candidate for each office. The reason is the elected officers, as a rule,

will pass through the chairs somewhat similar to a fraternal organization, starting as Secretary and progressing finally to the Presidency. This is not to imply that it is a cut and dried proposition because as mentioned above, nominations can and are accepted from the floor, and they also have to earn the right, based upon their efforts, to progress to the next chair. The advantages of this procedure is that when a couple finally obtains the office of President they have a complete and thorough knowledge of all aspects in the Association's operations.

So, in closing, you can see that our system works somewhat like the Electoral College we have in our own government. And as a man once said, "It may not be the best system but it's way ahead of whatever is in second place."

Wishing all of you a Happy and Prosperous New Year. We'll see you Jan. 4 at the Anniversary Dance.

Cal Band Fund Needs HELP!!

The American Revolution Bicentennial Administration recently announced its official recognition of the University of California Band's projected 1976 tour.

The Cal Band's tour will last six weeks, from June 19 to July 31, 1976. The Band will travel over 10,000 miles, performing in 22 states. The Band's show for this tour, "Spirit of America", is billed as a celebration of our country's musical and cultural heritage. Featured are dixieland, jazz, vaudeville, song, dance, concert, and marching.

The Bicentennial Administration has cataloged over 11,800 projects for the national celebration in '76. Of these, only 200 have received official recognition from the national administration.

The Cal Band is the only college marching Band to receive this official recognition. The Band joins the United States Armed Forces Bicentennial Band as the two touring musical performing groups to be so recognized.

The Band's tour is the second project from the University of California at Berkeley to be recognized, making the University of California the only educational institution in the country to have two projects officially recognized.

The Bicentennial Administration recognition marks the latest in a long series of official endorsements the Cal Band tour has received. The Bicentennial Tour was previously endorsed by the U.C. Berkeley campus Bicentennial committee, the Regents of the University of California, the San Francisco Twin Bicentennial Administration, and the American Revolution Bicentennial Commission of California.

The Bicentennial Tour is being funded by the bandmen themselves and through donations and contributions from friends and alumni. The U.C. Development Office is coordinating a fund-raising drive of \$150,000. Tax deductible contributions may be sent to: The Cal Band Fund, U.C. Development Office, Berkeley, Ca. 94720.
