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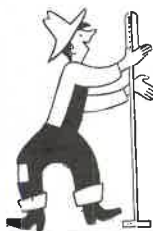

The Round Up Corner

While the voices of our top ten anniversary callers are still echoing through the Richmond Auditorium, the Northern California Square Dancers Association are hard at work preparing for the 23rd Annual Gold-

en State Round-up. "The Spirit of '76" will be held in the San Francisco Civic Auditorium on May 28, 29, 30, 1976.

Led by our "spirited" General Chairmen, John and Mary Lou Richter, the event has been endorsed by and is included in the San Francisco Twin Bicentennial Program, celebrating the 200th Birthday of both the city and our country.

Bill and Betty Peters, Program Chairmen, are guaranteeing your dancing pleasure with featured callers including Frank Lane of Estes Park, Colorado; Chuck Bryant, from San Antonio, Texas; and Dave Taylor of Naperville, Illinois.

Forrest and Kay Richards, Round Dance Chairmen, will present the Round Dance Team of Jack and Darlene Chaffee from Mesa, Arizona with workshops and dancing none of you will want to miss.

Since our forefathers included dancing of a type leading to our present Western Square Dancing, we thought you might be interested in some of the history of our favorite pastime which will come in for the international attention it deserves during this bicentennial year.

We're not too sure of our beginnings - it has been traced back to the Moors in North Africa and on through the English - the earliest book was the "English Dancing Master" (1650) a sort of May-day Round which was a "pagan quasi-religious ceremonial". The French refined the movements with the bowing and saluting and more of the Quadrille type of dancing which seems to require the instructions of a dancing master. There also seems to have been a bit of Spanish/Mexican influence along with the European folk dancing thrown in.

The Morris dance is recorded in American History back in the late 1660's. This was danced by six men in two rows of three, each wearing leather pads with bells around each leg. In order to make the bells ring while dancing, they had to adopt a very lively step. Minuet, quadrilles and Virginia Reels are all part of our ancestry. However, the Kentucky Running Set, found in the mountains of Kentucky and throughout the southern Appalachians, is one of the most pure forms from England and thought to have more of the spirit and form of our own western square dancing. This evolved into the great circle dance with many couples joining in a large circle, using some of our current figures - i.e. right and left

through, two ladies change, etc.

The dancing became more lively, fiddles were often the only type of instruments available as our dancers moved westward, and the costumes were usually the clothes of the day. Often the dancing was done on the hard pebbles around the campfires to the tune of "Turkey in the Straw". Dances and calls were never written down, but were transmitted from caller to caller orally without choral or record as are most "country folk" type of traditions. Often the caller was a member of the square, giving instructions as he danced. Still later, the dancing was done in the homes with neighbors and children joining.

About the end of the 19th century, the square dance began to fade and all but disappeared except in the rural areas as the towns and cities grew and people moved from the farms and ranches. Still, some remembered the calling and dancing of their youth, but had forgotten how to prompt and lead the dancers in the square.

In the 1920's Henry Ford and Mrs. Ford invited dancers to use their hall in the restored Greenfield Village at Dearborn, Michigan. They often joined in the dancing themselves. The newspapers played up the activities and soon square dance clubs began to form once again.

About this same time, a school superintendent named Lloyd Shaw living in Colorado and working with a group of young people from the Cheyenne Mountain High School, was contacted by a caller named Guy Parker who asked them to join with him in a square dance contest. From here, Lloyd Shaw and his dancers searched out information in all areas, eventually gleaned enough information to write his book "Cowboy Dances" - still the bible of the history, calls, and other information on your favorite form of dance. In his book he describes how the New England formal dances given by the "best people" gradually intermingled with the sagebrush as the cowboy put on his "white collar" and went in to dance with these "best people" until the modified western dances were carried back to New England by returning sons, thus completing the circle.

From these humble beginnings we have grown to about 30 million dancers in at least 30 countries around the world with most of the calls, of necessity, being in English - or should we call it Square Dancelese? The

tempo has changed to a faster beat - the clothing is much freer - and thanks to the electronic age with all the sound equipment - the caller - who was unable to project his voice throughout an entire hall, can now be heard by thousands of dancers at once. Records and flip records also have enhanced our dancing. According to Bill Burleson there have been approximately 2200 different calls presented to the dancers.

In this, our bicentennial year, the Square Dance will be recognized as the National Folk Dance of America and has been declared an official American Revolution Bicentennial Event.
