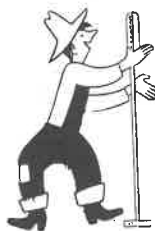

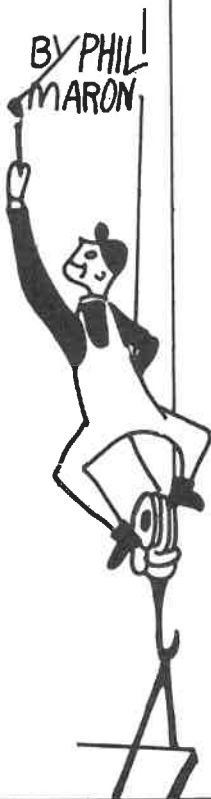

'President's Message'

Over the past months we have discussed the many jobs which we, the dancers, perform within both our own clubs and the NCSDA to better enhance our dancing. However, as important as these functions are, they would all be for naught if it were not for the individuals who are the nucleus, if you will, of our square dance world. These, of course, are the callers. They who give so much of their time, energy and talents to ensure our enjoyment of square dancing.

In line with this there have been many questions raised to the Association this year as to the method in selecting callers for the Golden State Round-Up and Stampedes put on through the efforts of the NCSDA. First of all it has been a standing rule governed by the Association By-Laws (refer to NCSDA Standing Rules, Page 2, Stampede #1) that the current Treasurer shall select those callers needed for the following year's Stampedes, subject to approval by the executive board. Considering the custom of alternating the Stampedes with first our local callers and the next one with callers from out of town, it presents a tremendous coordinating effort. Secondly, as to the Round-Up callers, this selection also falls to the Treasurer. Due to these callers coming from out of state the coordinating efforts become even greater than for a Stampede. In both cases there is not only a great amount of correspondence and telephone calls required to determine availability but also travel to listen and talk to these callers to ensure he makes the best possible choice. In some cases he may ask that a caller send him a tape if he is unable to hear him in person. Due to the busy schedule of the callers, selection has to be made well in advance of the required date. In regards the Stampedes they are booked at least a year ahead. As to the Round-Up, the Treasurer is looking forward to the year he becomes President, if elected. This means an advance booking of almost three years.

In conclusion, based on the fine track record of excellent calling we have experienced in the past, I think you can now understand why the aforementioned procedure is used, resulting in the greatest Square Dance Festivals in the country.

FRANK LANE

Frank started square dancing in 1939 with an exhibition group from Central High School, St. Joseph, Missouri. Following a three year stint as a pilot with the 15th Air Force in Italy, he graduated from the University of Kansas with a degree in advertising. He started calling in 1948 in Hutchinson, Kansas, as a hobby and organized and called for "Ranch Hand Square Dance Clubs" in Kansas City, St. Louis and Denver, as well as being club caller for the Hi Neighbor Club of Wichita, Kansas. After conducting festivals and workshops all over the country and Canada, in 1955, he was selected as one of five callers to appear on the first nation-wide color telecast from the National Square Dance Convention in Oklahoma City.

By 1954, Frank found himself so busy with his hobby and at the same time working as an advertising manager of the Chanute Tribune, Chanute, Kansas, that he had to make a decision - do less calling or give up the advertising business. To the better-

ment of Square Dancing, he made the only intelligent decision and started calling full time. Along with his wife, Barbara, Frank travels about 120,000 miles around the United States and five provinces in Canada yearly, calling and teaching. They have conducted cruises for square dancing to the Caribbean and Hawaii. In addition to the busy schedule, in 1968, Frank built, owns, and operates his own "Dance Ranch" four miles southeast of Estes Park in Colorado, where, from June until Labor Day he calls five nights each week for thousands of tourists and vacationing square dancers from every point of the compass. He is on the staff at Kirkwood Lodge, Osage Beach, Missouri, and also at the Winter Asilomar Institute at Pacific Grove, California. He conducts annual square dance weekends at Ramada Inn, St. Joseph, Missouri, The Park Manor Hotel, Niagara Falls, Ontario and the University of Indiana, Bloomington, Indiana. In addition, he holds a five-day Caller's College each July at the Dance Ranch. As if all this is not enough, over the past 18 years, Frank has recorded for three record companies, Black Mountain, Sets in Order, and Scope and now has his own Label "Dance Ranch Records".
