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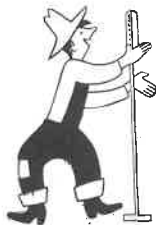
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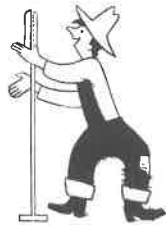

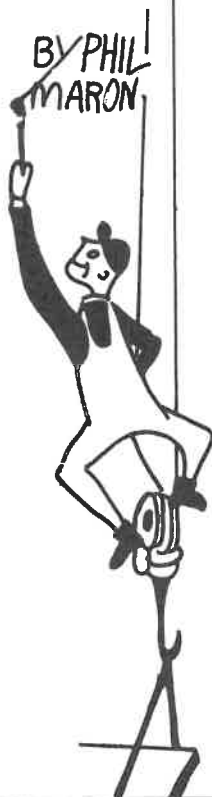

every year when the Group Medical Insurance coverage, made available through your Association, is up for renewal, for all NCSDA club members only, we always seem to hear the same comments. "Who needs it!"; "What good is it!"; "Great!"; "Glad to hear it's continued!".

Even though these comments appear to be contradictory they are understandable when you realize that the negative remarks are from those who probably aren't aware of what the coverage entails. In hopes of clarifying this situation the benefits are as follows: \$2,000 accidental loss of life; \$5,000 accidental loss of sight and dismemberment; \$1,000 accidental medical treatment with **NO DEDUCTIBLE CLAUSE**; and a \$250 dental limit. No other policy of this kind has dental coverage.

These benefits are for **ANY SQUARE DANCE ACTIVITY** and will cover the member while going directly to, while at, and when returning directly home, and will pay in addition to any other coverage which the member may have. The cost of all this coverage is only \$1 (one) per person per year or less than .09 cents per month, which, we think you'll agree is a pretty good deal, and with medical costs constantly increasing any extra protection we can get surely helps.

A couple of stipulated advantages of the program are that the newer dancers are immediately covered upon graduation for the balance of the policy year and even though you belong to more than one Square Dance Club, membership is required only through one club for complete coverage. If you have any questions or are in need of a claim form, please contact your Club Delegate, District Director, or Ethel Pitt, the NCSDA Insurance Chairman.

We sincerely hope that none of you have need to take advantage of this plan but if you must, it's comforting to know it is available and also realize that this is just one more area that your Northern California

Square Dance Association is working to serve you better.

Continuing with our resumé's of our featured callers, may we present:

CHUCK BRYANT - full time professional square dance caller and retired Air Force veteran from San Antonio, Texas, who has been calling for fourteen years. Some of you may remember Chuck as the Director of the "Alamo Street Dance" held for three nights at the 1974 Nationals. He is a member of L.E.G.A.C.Y. (Leaders in Square and Round Dancing) and Callerlab (an international association of square dance callers). He has been the featured caller at several State Festivals and special dances throughout the United States as well as being on the staff of many Callers' Clinics and vacation resorts. Included in the feathers in his hat are the Lighted Lantern and Valiceto Resort in Colorado, Gatlinburg Hoe-down in Tennessee, the Citrus Festival in the Texas Valley, and Winter Wonderland at French Lick, Indiana. When home in San Antonio, he calls for five clubs in the San Antonio-Austin areas and is also owner/producer of the Mustang and Lightning S Square Dance Record Company, recording on the Mustang label.

DAVE TAYLOR - began his calling in 1954, devoting the first year to children, one night stands, and beginners classes, prior to branching out in his bookings. Dave was a school teacher in Detroit for nineteen years before moving to the Chicago area in 1973. While still in Detroit, he was a square dance disc jockey for two years on radio station WJLB, calling his segment "The Square Dance Club of the Air", and appearing on television several times also. He has been the staff director at Boyne Mountain and Boyne Highlands for eleven years, where he directed more than fifty weeks of square dance institutes and several callers' clinics. Dave's talents are known at festivals and conventions in such far-flung places as Austria, England, Greece, Germany, Puerto

Rico, Canada, Bermuda, and Mexico. Admitted to the Square Dance Hall of Fame in 1970, he records for Blue Star. Presently, Dave and his wife, Angie, operate a successful home program and Angie accompanies him occasionally on weekends and festivals - not too easy a task since they have five children and two grandchildren.

JACK AND DARLENE CHAFFEE - began teaching Round Dancing in 1960. Through the years in Denver, they developed a very active home program with three clubs, two beginners classes each year, and were instrumental in organizing the Colorado Round Dancers Association. They have served on staffs at Asilomar, Kirkwood Lodge, Fun Valley, Prudhommes in Canada, while conducting their own Round Dance weekend at Western Hills Lodge in Oklahoma. They too are known throughout the United States, Canada, and Europe.

In October, 1973, Jack and Darlene accepted the offer to teach both Round Dance and Ballroom dancing at Trailer Village in Mesa, Arizona and have organized everyone into beginners, easy-level, intermediate, and advanced Round Dance groups. As Resident Round Dance and Ballroom Instructors, they are free on weekends to continue handling various clinics, workshops and festivals throughout the world and still enjoy the "Good Life" at Trailer Village, Mesa, Arizona.
