I would like to share my findings with you. The San Rafael Fire & Rescue Department has informed me that a "C.P.R." (cardio pulmonary resuscitation) orientation training course is available to the public upon request, with instructions

also being given on procedures for obtaining prompt local emergency service. There is no fee for this and it is available to any club or group through your nearest local Fire Department upon request... "Food for thought:" Peace of mind can be in taking advantage of such an opportunity to be properly prepared. Please do, NOW... Sincerely, your associate editor.
