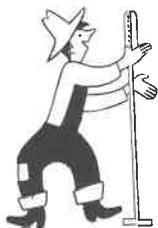

No. Calif. Square Dancers Ass'n 'President's Message' **DON & WILMA TINSLEY**

Many people that we have talked with ask, "Why do we belong to the Association?" This is the common question by members of a club. The first answer must be, "In union there is strength", large numbers of people working together on one common cause.

WHAT DOES NCSDA DO?

A. We provide a forum for the exchange of ideas and aids for the member club dancers. There are many clubs started without the least knowledge of how to organize themselves, hire a caller or obtain a hall. We can provide this if only asked. Attendance at the General Meeting are encouraged to participate in some of these ideas and to contribute with skills and knowledge for the good of the other dancers.

B. The Officers of NCSDA contribute their knowledge, time and skills in arranging benefits for you, setting up dance events, and meeting with neighboring Associations to exchange knowledge, and avert conflicts of time and place with clubs in neighboring Associations. We are also affiliates of a state-wide dance council, to perform similar functions on a state wide basis, so that our major events do not clash.

B. As a member club, your club delegate and alternate delegate, as back-up, have one vote that shapes the way this association shall act. They are to bring back to the club, who will direct them how to cast their vote, any information that requires a major decision. The dancers, as you can see, make the major decisions.

D. The District Directors and their assistants have set up dance calendars within the Districts. These are for the use of the clubs so as not to set up a party in conflict with neighboring clubs. It has worked well in most Districts.

E. NCSDA holds several major events each year. 5th Saturday Stampedes, Anniversary Dance in January and, of course, the Golden State Round-Up in May.

F. We provide Group Insurance. No club in its right mind should be without Liability

Insurance against damage claims. We provide this insurance at a small fraction of the individual cost. This also allows us as an Association to hold larger dance events that the individual club could neither handle or afford. This is something to think about; we were recently asked to furnish a one million dollar insurance policy for the use of one hall.

Due to the lack of space and your tiring spirit, (I have never been accused of being short-winded). WILMA and I wish you happy dancing. If you have any questions in regard to the services that the Association has, contact your Delegate or Alternate Delegate for the answers. If they cannot help you I am sure that they will get the answers for you.

NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE CONVENTION EDUCATION SEMINAR A "BIG SUCCESS"

The 25th National Square Dance Convention held recently in Anaheim left a gift to the local community that will long be remembered and appreciated. As part of the official program school teachers and youth leaders were invited to attend a special program designed to teach them how to teach square dancing to youngsters. One hundred and eleven leaders accepted the invitation and spent twenty hours in class sessions. Under the tutelage of Bob Ruff and Jack Murtha, California educators and creators of the instructional series "The Fundamentals of Square Dancing", the class learned the basic calls, danced party materials, watched demonstrations by skilled

elementary pupils and special education students, attended the convention pageant depicting 200 years of dance in America, visited the dancing areas in the convention center and participated in a one-night stand square dance party.

The class was co-sponsored by the convention and The University of California at Irvine. Two quarter units of college credit were earned by those teachers enrolled. Two classes were offered; one for beginners who had little or no experience in teaching square dancing and a second for experienced teachers and square dancers who wanted to learn how to teach. The first course covered Level 1 and 2 in the Ruff/Murtha Instructional Series while the second covered Level 3 and Calling. Level 3 includes all calls contained in the Basic 50 Program of American Square Dancing or all 38 calls in Cal-lerlab's Basic Program.
