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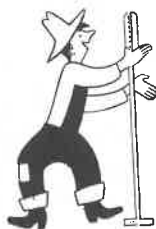
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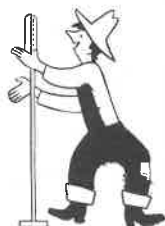

PHIL A Tribute To MARON

Enthusiasm has been described as the fuel of enterprise. A real enthusiast is one who not only dives into an enterprise, but who also sticks with it. PHIL MARON fills that description.

Newer dancers know PHIL as the fellow who lists the latest Square and Round Dance records in "The Record Review" in Square Dance-Where? Those who look closer will discover he is the owner of a pioneer square and folk dance shop on Clay Street in downtown Oakland. But, if you dig deeper, you will find out that PHIL MARON was one of the Bay Area's earliest square dance callers!

Let's go back a ways. PHIL was born in Salem, West Virginia, and was introduced to folk dancing in grammar school. In his early adult years in New York, he was caught up in the square and folk dance movement, which was being featured as part of Americana at the New York World's Fair. At that time, his involvement was in photographing the dancing, for a pictorial record. But he joined a dance group called the "Squares and Rounds", directed by Don Chambers. It is of interest that contra figures were part of the scene in those times too. During this era, PHIL came to know Ralph Page, and both Al & Bob Brundage, all of whom are still prominent figures in square dance calling. During World War II the "Squares and Rounds" were very active with service personnel in the New York area, both in teaching and exhibiting square dancing.

PHIL came west to stay, in 1946, and promptly organized the first square dance group in Oakland, the "American Square Dancers", centered at the Oakland YMCA. As its caller, he joined with other leader-callers to help found the Square Dance Callers Association of Northern California, the publisher of Square Dance-Where? PHIL was the first historian of the budding S.D.C.A.N.C., a job at which he could indulge his other hobby of photography. Today, at each S.D.C.A.N.C. meeting, PHIL is there with his big supply of square and round dance records and other callers' accessories. One can enjoy a delightful hour browsing thru his Clay Street shop, where he has a full line of other square dancers' needs. Like all our other fine suppliers, PHIL also shows his supplies at the annual Golden State Round-Up, to help both old and new dancers. But with this added difference, you can talk to a real square dance pioneer, whose enthusiasm for our fine recreation has helped it grow and prosper. Here's to you, PHIL MARON.

The Square Dancers of America Committee is proud to announce that the chassis and overall structure for our entry in the January 1, 1977 Tournament of Roses Parade in Pasadena, California is now complete and will soon be ready for those final hectic days before the parade when hundreds of square dancer volunteers will cover it with flowers and other natural materials.

It depicts a lovely day in the countryside where several families are gathered for a day in the park. In a wooded area graceful trees form a shady canopy overhead as the families enjoy the view from the river bank. A rustic fence meanders around the shady grove. Seated at picnic tables several people are enjoying their picnic, while at the rear others are out for a stroll, fishing and sailing a toy boat in the stream. At the front of the float eight people are square dancing to the lively music coming from an old-fashioned Victrola.

The trees will be covered with a variety of roses for a mass color effect. Cascades of roses by the thousands spill over the grassy ledge. Real bark and a variety of seeds and flower petals are used for tree trunks and limbs. The sculptured figures are covered with petals from orchids, carnations and leaves. Earthy color at base of trees is achieved by use of mums, leaves and bark. Dozens of specifically designed floral arrangements complement the float.

The response to our appeal for dancer couples to dance on the float has been great. Their names will be drawn by lot at a "Float the Float" dance to be held in Palomares Park, Pomona, November 14, 1976. Only one couple will be from California.
